39 **HB08-1186** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to
40 the Committee of the Whole with favorable
41 recommendation:

43 Amend printed bill, page 2, after line 1, insert the following:

1 **"SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general
2 assembly hereby finds that:

3
4 (a) In 2000, the general assembly enacted section 22-7-604,
5 Colorado Revised Statutes, pursuant to which the department of education
6 annually calculates academic performance ratings for each public school
7 based on the scores attained by students enrolled in the school on the
8 Colorado student assessment program tests;

9
10 (b) The formula for calculating the academic performance ratings
11 includes weighting the students' scores based on the proficiency level
12 reflected by each score;

13
14 (c) If a student is absent for one of the Colorado student
15 assessment program tests, and does not subsequently make up the test,
16 that student is assigned a zero score, which falls at the proficiency level
17 of "unsatisfactory", which receives a weighting of -0.5;

18
19 (d) Further, if a teacher inadvertently fails to follow the
20 department of education's guidelines in administering the test, all of the
21 students in the class receive a zero score, again increasing the percentage
22 of scores for that school that receive a weighting of -0.5;

23
24 (e) Thus, the formula for calculating academic performance
25 ratings unfairly penalizes a school for each student who misses one of the
26 Colorado student assessment program tests or for an inadvertent error in
27 administering a test, regardless of why the student did not take the test
28 and regardless of the student's actual knowledge level with respect to the
29 subject matter;

30
31 (f) Parental choice in education has been a guiding tenet in
32 education policy in this state for several years and is a core value of the
33 statewide system of public education in Colorado;

34
35 (g) Parents are in the best position to decide what is best and
36 appropriate for their children's education, whether the decision pertains
37 to the educational setting in which the child should be placed, the
38 educational services the child should receive, or whether the child should
39 participate in statewide testing;

40
41 (h) While federal law requires schools to encourage universal
42 participation in the Colorado student assessment program tests, the state
43 must recognize and honor a parent's choice with regard to whether the
44 parent's child participates in the tests.

45
46 (2) The general assembly concludes, therefore, that a school's
47 overall academic performance rating should be an authentic reflection of
48 what the students in the school know and are able to demonstrate. In
49 calculating an overall academic performance rating, a school should not
50 be punished for students who are absent due to a parent's refusal to allow
51 his or her child to participate in the testing and a school should not be
52 punished because of an inadvertent failure to follow departmental
53 guidelines in administering the test."
