A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE USE OF MONEYS IN THE COLORADO CUSTOMIZED
102 TRAINING PROGRAM FOR NEW ENERGY ECONOMY TRAINING
103 PROGRAMS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Joint Select Committee on Job Creation and Economic Growth. Permits moneys available from the Colorado customized training program to be used to train potential employees, establish programs related to training, and help companies train employees for participation in Colorado's new energy economy.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** 23-60-306 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
3 amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:

4 **23-60-306. Colorado customized training program - creation**
5 **- policy - functions of the state board for community colleges and**
6 **occupational education.** (3) (n.5) TO ENHANCE THE ABILITY OF
7 COLORADANS TO PARTICIPATE IN COLORADO'S NEW ENERGY ECONOMY AS
8 THE TERM IS CONSTRUED BY THE COLORADO OFFICE OF ECONOMIC
9 DEVELOPMENT, MONEYS MAY BE AVAILABLE FROM THE COLORADO
10 CUSTOMIZED TRAINING PROGRAM FOR USE IN TRAINING POTENTIAL
11 EMPLOYEES, ESTABLISHING PROGRAMS RELATED TO TRAINING, AND
12 HELPING COMPANIES TO TRAIN EMPLOYEES IN COLORADO'S NEW ENERGY
13 ECONOMY.

14 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
15 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
