controllers, all sites and over 140 dispatch console positions. The system is currently at SR7.2 and will be upgraded to SR7.5in 2Q09.							
Public Safety Interoperable Communications (PSIC) Grant Funding: The Colorado All Hazards Regions and the State of Colorado used a significant portion of the statewide PSIC funding to purchase subscriber equipment and DTI infrastructure, including funding 5 new DTRS sites (reflected in the total above).							
Regions statewide also continue to use Homeland Security grant funds to ensure							
basic interoperability for first responder agencies.
