
- # 2-day, 100 chair dental clinic

Dentistry: A Critical Part of Wellness

- The head and body are connected. The health of your mouth substantially affects the health of the rest of your body.
 - 25 This fact is often not acknowledged in health care policy.
- Poor oral health causes many systemic problems.
- Poor oral health also affects mental well being, selfesteem, employment opportunities and more.

Dentistry is Prevention

- Good oral health can prevent many health problems and not only in the mouth.
- Identifying and treating problems early can eliminate substantial costs later – both in dental and other medical care.
- Much of current health care policy emphasizes preventative measures, but oral health is often overlooked.
- Many people don't have a means to access preventative dental care.

Economics of Dentistry

- Over 60° a of Coloradans do not have dental insurance.


Medicaid

Medicaid: Counties 1 or less Provider






