- (1.5) "Acupuncture" means the puncture of the skin with fine needles for diagnostic and therapeutic purposes "Animal vertebral subluxation" means a lesion or dysfunction in a joint or motion segment in which alignment, movement integrity, or physiological function are altered, although contact between joint surfaces remains intact, which may influence biomechanical and neural integrity. Diagnosis of animal vertebral subluxation typically involves evaluation of gait and radiographs, and static and motion palpation techniques that are utilized to identify joint dysfunction. Diagnosis of animal vertebral subluxation does not include methods such as applied kinesiology, reflexology, pendulum divining, or thermography.
- 18 (1.7) "CHIROPRACTIC" MEANS THAT BRANCH OF THE HEALING ARTS THAT IS BASED ON THE PREMISE THAT DISEASE IS ATTRIBUTABLE TO 19 THE ABNORMAL FUNCTIONING OF THE HUMAN NERVOUS SYSTEM. IT 20 21 INCLUDES THE DIAGNOSING AND ANALYZING OF HUMAN AILMENTS AND SEEKS THE ELIMINATION OF THE ABNORMAL FUNCTIONING OF THE HUMAN 22 23 NERVOUS SYSTEM BY THE ADJUSTMENT OR MANIPULATION, BY HAND OR INSTRUMENT, OF THE ARTICULATIONS AND ADJACENT TISSUE OF THE 24 HUMAN BODY, PARTICULARLY THE SPINAL COLUMN, AND THE USE AS 25 INDICATED OF PROCEDURES THAT FACILITATE AND MAKE THE ADJUSTMENT 26 OR MANIPULATION MORE EFFECTIVE, AND THE USE OF SANITARY, 27 28 HYGIENIC, NUTRITIONAL, AND PHYSICAL REMEDIAL MEASURES FOR THE 29 PROMOTION, MAINTENANCE, AND RESTORATION OF HEALTH, THE 30 PREVENTION OF DISEASE, AND THE TREATMENT OF HUMAN AILMENTS. "CHIROPRACTIC" INCLUDES THE USE OF VENIPUNCTURE FOR DIAGNOSTIC 31 PURPOSES. "CHIROPRACTIC" INCLUDES TREATMENT BY ACUPUNCTURE 32 WHEN PERFORMED BY AN APPROPRIATELY TRAINED CHIROPRACTOR AS 33 34 DETERMINED BY THE COLORADO STATE BOARD OF CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINERS. NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY TO PERSONS USING 35 ACUPUNCTURE NOT LICENSED BY THE BOARD. 36

Information in the database shall be open to public inspection at all times and shall be easily accessible in electronic form.
- (b) A LICENSED CHIROPRACTOR WHO CHOOSES TO PRACTICE 14 ANIMAL CHIROPRACTIC AND WHO SEEKS REGISTRATION IN ANIMAL 15 CHIROPRACTIC SHALL PROVIDE THE STATE BOARD OF CHIROPRACTIC 16 EXAMINERS WITH REGISTRATION INFORMATION ESTABLISHED BY THE 17 BOARD, WHICH SHALL INCLUDE THE CHIROPRACTOR'S NAME, CURRENT 18 ADDRESS, EDUCATION AND TRAINING IN THE FIELD OF ANIMAL 19 CHIROPRACTIC, ACTIVE COLORADO CHIROPRACTIC LICENSE, AND 20 OUALIFICATIONS TO PERFORM ANIMAL CHIROPRACTIC AND TREATMENT. 21 FORMS FOR CHIROPRACTORS TO PROVIDE SUCH INFORMATION SHALL BE 22 23 PROVIDED BY THE BOARD.
- (4) Educational qualifications. A LICENSED CHIROPRACTOR WHO 24 SEEKS REGISTRATION IN ANIMAL CHIROPRACTIC SHALL OBTAIN EDUCATION 25 IN THE FIELD OF ANIMAL CHIROPRACTIC FROM AN ACCREDITED COLLEGE 26 OF VETERINARY MEDICINE, ACCREDITED COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC, OR 27 AN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM DEEMED EQUIVALENT BY MUTUAL 28 AGREEMENT OF THE STATE BOARD OF CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINERS AND THE 29 STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE. THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM 30 SHALL CONSIST OF NO FEWER THAN TWO HUNDRED TEN HOURS, INCLUDE 31 BOTH CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION AND CLINICAL EXPERIENCE, AND 32 CULMINATE WITH A PROFICIENCY EVALUATION.  TWENTY HOURS OF CONTINUING EDUCATION, PER LICENSING PERIOD, THAT
 IS SPECIFIC TO THE DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT OF ANIMALS. ALL
 CONTINUING EDUCATION COURSES SHALL BE IN THE FIELDS OF STUDY
 LISTED IN SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION.
- 7 (6) Records and professional collaboration. (a) A LICENSED 8 VETERINARIAN WHO PROVIDES VETERINARY MEDICAL CLEARANCE FOR 9 ANIMAL CHIROPRACTIC MAY REQUIRE A VETERINARIAN'S PRESENCE AT 10 ANY CHIROPRACTIC TREATMENT RENDERED PURSUANT TO THE 11 VETERINARY MEDICAL CLEARANCE.
- 12 (b) THE CHIROPRACTOR AND THE VETERINARIAN SHALL CONTINUE
 13 PROFESSIONAL COLLABORATION AS NECESSARY FOR THE WELL-BEING OF
 14 THE ANIMAL PATIENT. THE VETERINARIAN SHALL PROVIDE THE ANIMAL
 15 PATIENT'S MEDICAL RECORD TO THE CHIROPRACTOR UPON REQUEST.
- 16 (c) The Chiropractor shall maintain an animal patient
