38 I am filing with the Secretary of State House Bill 09-1180, "Concerning
39 allowing valid Colorado concealed handgun permits to satisfy
40 background check requirements for transfers of firearms." I vetoed this
41 bill as of 1:47 p.m., and this letter sets forth my reasons for doing so.

42
43 House Bill 09-1180 would exempt a firearm purchaser from the criminal
44 background check requirement upon the presentation of a concealed
45 handgun permit and one other piece of identification. Current law
46 requires each person who desires to purchase a firearm to undergo a
47 criminal background check. Under current law, a person is denied the
48 privilege of purchasing a firearm if he or she fails a criminal background
49 check. The circumstances that will result in a failure of a criminal
50 background check include, but are not limited to: conviction of burglary,
51 arson, or any felony involving the use of force or the use of a deadly
52 weapon; conviction of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term
53 exceeding one year; conviction of a misdemeanor crime of domestic
54 violence; being adjudicated mentally ill or committed to a mental
55 institution; being dishonorably discharged from the Armed Forces; and
56 being subject to a court order that restrains a person from harassing,

1 stalking, threatening, or engaging in other conduct that would place an
2 intimate partner or the partner's child in reasonable fear of bodily injury,
3 if the court order was entered after a hearing meeting certain procedural
4 conditions. *See* C.R.S. § 24-33.5-424(3)(a); 18 U.S.C. § 922(g).

5
6 In addition, a person is barred from purchasing a firearm if he or she has
7 been arrested for, charged with, or indicted of any crime that, if
8 convicted, would be a bar to the purchase of a firearm. *See* C.R.S. § 24-
9 33.5-424(3)(b); 18 U.S.C. § 922(n). Such an
10 arrest, charge, or indictment is a bar so long as there has been no final
11 disposition of the case or the final disposition is not noted in a criminal
12 database. *Id.*

13
14 There are numerous troubling aspects to this bill. First, this bill contains
15 inadequate safeguards to ensure that those who should not be able to
16 purchase a firearm promptly surrender their concealed handgun permits
17 upon the occurrence of a disqualifying event, such as an arrest for a
18 violent felony or the entry of a protective order for harassing or stalking
19 a spouse. Although current law requires a sheriff to revoke a permit if
20 the permittee is no longer qualified to purchase a firearm and section 5
21 of the bill requires a sheriff to confiscate a concealed handgun permit
22 upon revocation, there is nothing in the bill that assures that revocation
23 will take place promptly upon a disqualifying event. *See* C.R.S. § 18-12-
24 203(3)(a)-(c). This is because House Bill 09-1180 does nothing to help
25 assure that a sheriff who issued a concealed handgun permit is promptly
26 notified of a disqualifying event. In short, it is easily foreseeable that a
27 potential purchaser will be in possession of a concealed handgun permit
28 for a substantial period of time after the potential purchaser would no
29 longer be qualified to purchase a firearm. Under such circumstances only
30 a criminal background check conducted contemporaneously with a
31 purchase would prevent an unqualified person from purchasing a firearm.

32
33 Second, there is nothing in the bill that assures that law enforcement will
34 be aware that a person that they arrest has a concealed handgun permit.
35 There is no central database of permittees. In fact, law enforcement
36 agencies are expressly prohibited from maintaining any kind of statewide
37 database of concealed handgun permittees after July 1, 2011. *See* C.R.S.
38 § 18-12-206(3)(b). This lack of a readily available means of verifying
39 whether an arrestee has been issued a concealed handgun permit further
40 exacerbates the concern that there will routinely be a substantial delay
41 between a disqualifying event and the surrender of a permit.

42
43 Third, there is no requirement that a firearm seller verify the validity of
44 a concealed handgun permit before making the sale. In fact, there are
45 impediments to doing so. For instance, current law places substantial
46 limits on a sheriff's ability to share information regarding who has a valid
47 concealed weapons permit. Specifically, existing law only authorizes a
48 sheriff to disclose the identity of a concealed weapon permittee to
49 "another criminal justice agency for law enforcement purposes," and
50 even then the decision to disclose such information rests within the
51 sheriff's "sole discretion." *See* C.R.S. § 18-12-206(3)(a). There is
52 nothing in this bill or existing statute that clearly authorizes a sheriff to
53 disclose to a firearm seller the identity of a person who holds a concealed
54 weapons permit. This impediment to the sharing of information
55 regarding permittees is a further reason that the possession of a concealed

1 handgun permit is an inadequate substitute for a contemporaneous
2 criminal background check.

3
4 Fourth, this bill makes it easier for those intent on illegally obtaining a
5 firearm. Although the bill requires the Colorado Bureau of Investigation
6 to create a permit template that is "resistant to tampering and fraud," no
7 identification document is impervious to forgery. Establishing a
8 background check bypass for those with a concealed handgun permit,
9 creates one more opportunity for those intent on circumventing the
10 criminal background check.

11
12 Finally, this bill weakens the Colorado Background Check Act. One of
13 the guns used in the shootings at Columbine high school in 1999 was
14 purchased at a gun show by an eighteen year old "straw man" without a
15 criminal background check. In the wake of that tragedy, Colorado
16 passed the Colorado Background Check Act into law as Amendment 22
17 in the 2000 general election. Amendment 22 passed by a greater than
18 two-to-one margin. The Act closed the "gun show loophole" by
19 requiring those who purchase firearms at gun shows to undergo the same
20 background checks as those purchasing firearms from licensed dealers.
21 *See* C.R.S. § 12-26.1-101, *et seq.* By establishing a criminal background
22 check bypass, this bill reopens the very loophole that Colorado citizen
23 voted overwhelmingly to close less than nine years ago.

24
25 In short, House Bill 09-1180 significantly weakens the safeguards against
26 the illegal purchase of firearms. Accordingly, I have vetoed this bill.

44 I am filing with the Secretary of State House Bill 09-1170, "Concerning
45 unemployment insurance benefits for locked-out employees." I vetoed
46 this bill as of 4:55 p.m. today, and this letter sets forth my reasons for
47 doing so.

48
49 There are currently ongoing contract negotiations between the United
50 Food and Commercial Workers No. 7 and several grocery stores,
51 including King Soopers, Safeway, Albertsons, and City Market. The
52 parties to these negotiations have been working hard for several months
53 to try to reach an agreement. I believe it is ill-advised and
54 counterproductive to enact legislation that materially impacts the relative
55 bargaining position of parties in the midst of ongoing negotiations. In
56 these troubled economic times, I am deeply concerned about the effect

1 a strike or lockout of employees would have on grocery store workers
2 and consumers across the state, and I am concerned that signing this bill
3 into law will make a negotiated resolution of the grocery store contract
4 more difficult, not less. Therefore, under these circumstances, the state
5 should not interject itself into these contract negotiations by enacting
6 House Bill 09-1170 into law.

7
8 The merits of this bill, however, are worthy of future discussion and
9 perhaps future legislation. In 1999, the statutory provision that House
10 Bill 09-1170 would repeal and reenact was substantially amended for the
11 first time in twenty-four years, upsetting the longstanding balance
12 governing when locked-out and striking workers were eligible for
13 unemployment benefits. The issue of how best to restore this balance is
14 a debate that we should have. But the debate should be had and
15 legislation crafted outside of the shadow of a major contract negotiation
16 that has the imminent threat of a strike or lockout.

18 Accordingly, I have vetoed this bill.
