(a) The appropriation to the department of education, assistance to public schools, grant programs, distributions, and other assistance, reading and literacy, read-to-achieve grant program, from the read-to-achieve cash fund created in section 22-7-908 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is decreased by one million one hundred sixty-five thousand two hundred ninety-six dollars $(\$ 1,165,296)(\$ 165,296)$ cash funds.

ALL MONEYS COLLECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (4) SHALL BE TRANSMITTED TO THE STATE TREASURER, WHO SHALL CREDIT THE SAME TO THE GENERAL FUND.
(5) A SURCHARGE OF FIFTY CENTS IS HEREBY LEVIED AGAINST EACH PENALTY ASSESSMENT ISSUED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33-6-104, C.R.S., THAT RESULTS IN PAYMENT OF THE PENALTY ASSESSMENT without the commencement of a criminal action. All moneys COLLECTED BY THE DIVISION OF PARKS AND OUTDOOR RECREATION IN THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (6) SHALL BE TRANSMITTED TO THE STATE TREASURER, WHO SHALL CREDIT THE SAME TO THE GENERAL FUND.
(7) THE COURT MAY WAIVE A COST OR SURCHARGE LEVIED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION IF THE COURT DETERMINES THE DEFENDANT IS INDIGENT.
(8) THE MONEY TRANSFERRED TO THE GENERAL FUND PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL BE USED FOR THE COST OF IMPLEMENTING THE INCREASE IN THE STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS FOR VEHICULAR HOMICIDE AND LEAVING THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT THAT RESULTS IN THE DEATH OF THE PERSON IN SECTION 16-5-401 (1) (a), C.R.S.

officer shall contain the name and address of the defendant, the license number of the vehicle involved, if any, the number of the defendant's driver's license, if any, a citation of the statute alleged to have been violated, a brief description of the offense, the date and approximate location thereof, the amount of the penalty prescribed for the offense, the amount of the strecharge SURCHARGES thereon pursuant to sections 24-4.1-119(1)(f) and 24-4.2-104 (1) SECTIONS 18-25-101, 24-4.1-119 (1) (f), AND 24-4.2-104 (1), C.R.S., the number of points, if any, prescribed for the offense pursuant to section 42-2-127, and the date the penalty assessment notice is served on the defendant; shall direct the defendant to appear in a specified county court at a specified time and place in the event the penalty and sureharge SURCHARGES thereon are not paid; shall be signed by the peace officer; and shall contain a place for the defendant to elect to execute a signed acknowledgment of guilt and an agreement to pay the penalty prescribed and strecharge SURCHARGES thereon within twenty days, as well as such other information as may be required by law to constitute the penalty assessment notice to be a summons and complaint, should the prescribed penalty and sureharge SURCHARGES thereon not be paid within the time allowed in section 42-4-1701.

shall be signed by the peace officer; and shall contain a place for the defendant to elect to execute a signed acknowledgment of liability and an agreement to pay the penalty prescribed and strcharge SURCHARGES thereon within twenty days, as well as such other information as may be required by law to constitute the penalty assessment notice to be a summons and complaint, should the prescribed penalty and streharge SURCHARGES thereon not be paid within the time allowed in section 42-4-1701.

SECTION 6. 33-6-104, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

Penalty assessments shall not be issued for violations for which minimum and maximum fines have been established. The penalty assessment notice given to the alleged offender shall contain the information required in and be in the form of a summons and complaint and shall specify in dollars the amount of the penalty to be assessed for the alleged offense and the amount of the surcharge SURCHARGES to be collected pursuant to section 24-4.2-104 (1) SECTIONS 18-25-101 AND 24-4.2-104 (1), C.R.S. If the alleged offender accepts such notice and pays the fine and the streharge SURCHARGES entered thereon to the division within fifteen days of issuance of the notice, such acceptance and payment shall constitute an acknowledgment of guilt by such person of the violation set forth in the penalty assessment notice. Any person who accepts a penalty assessment notice but who does not furnish satisfactory evidence of identity or who the officer has reasonable and probable grounds to believe will disregard a written promise to pay the specified fine and surcharge SURCHARGES may be taken by the officer to the nearest known post-office facility and BE required to remit the amount of the specified fine and sureharge SURCHARGES to the division immediately by mail in United States currency or other legal tender by money order or personal check. Refusal or inability to remit the specified fine and streharge SURCHARGES by mail when required shall constitute a refusal to accept a penalty assessment notice. The officer shall advise the person arrested of the license suspension points to be assessed in accordance with section 33-6-106. Checks tendered by the violator to and accepted by the division and on which payment is received by the division shall be deemed sufficient receipt. If the fine and sureharge SURCHARGES are not so paid, then the officer who issued the penalty assessment notice shall docket the summons and complaint with a court of competent jurisdiction for appearance by the person to answer the charges therein contained at such time and place as is specified in the summons and complaint.
