(I) ONE YEAR AFTER THE FIRST DAY OF THE MEDICALLY NECESSARY LEAVE OF ABSENCE; OR

(II) THE DATE THE COVERAGE WOULD OTHERWISE TERMINATE UNDER THE TERMS OF THE PLAN OR HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE.

(b) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION "MEDICALLY NECESSARY LEAVE OF ABSENCE" MEANS A LEAVE OF ABSENCE FROM A POSTSECONDARY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION OR A CHANGE IN ENROLLMENT OF THE DEPENDENT AT THE INSTITUTION THAT BEGINS WHILE THE DEPENDENT IS SUFFERING FROM A SERIOUS ILLNESS, IS MEDICALLY NECESSARY, AND CAUSES THE DEPENDENT TO LOSE STUDENT STATUS FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEPENDENT COVERAGE."
