After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that SB09-050 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend printed bill, page 2, line 1, strike "(1)," and substitute "(1) and 12-47.1-301 (1) (a),";

line 2, strike "is" and substitute "are";

line 13, strike "AT LEAST ONE";

strike line 14;

line 15, strike "COUNTY.";

after line 18, insert the following:

"(a) One member of the commission shall have had at least five years' law enforcement experience as a peace officer certified pursuant to section 24-31-305, C.R.S.; one member shall be an attorney admitted to the practice of law in Colorado for not less than five years and who has experience in regulatory law; one member shall be a certified public accountant or public accountant who has been practicing in Colorado for at least five years and who has a comprehensive knowledge of the principles and practices of corporate finance; one member shall have been engaged in business in a management-level capacity for at least five years; and one member shall be a registered elector of the state who is not TELLER OR GILPIN COUNTY. THE REGISTERED ELECTOR MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION MAY BE employed in any A profession or industry otherwise described in this paragraph (a), BUT SHALL NOT OCCUPY THE PLACE ON THE COMMISSION THAT IS RESERVED FOR A PERSON EMPLOYED IN THAT PROFESSION OR INDUSTRY."

Page 3, strike line 15 and substitute the following:

"(I) THE MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION WHO IS A REGISTERED ELECTOR OF TELLER OR GILPIN COUNTY MAY LIVE WITH HIS OR HER FAMILY";

line 16, strike "CITIES" and substitute "CITY".
