Legislation for a Supplemental Appropriation to the Office of the State Auditor LLS No. 10-0269.01

What Would This Bill Do?

This Bill would amend the Legislative Branch Appropriations Bill for Fiscal Year 2010 (Senate Bill 09-224) to appropriate an additional \$130,000 in reappropriated funds for Fiscal Year 2010 to the Office of the State Auditor (OSA).

Why Is This Bill Necessary?

The OSA expects to incur about \$130,000 in additional costs during Fiscal Year 2010 to audit the use of monies expended by state agencies and public institutions of higher education under the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Recovery Act). The OSA requires additional spending authority in order to enter into contracts with CPA firms to conduct the auditing that will be necessary due to the expenditure of Recovery Act funds by the State.

This increased audit work is necessary because the Recovery Act is funneling additional federal funds to the State. Under the federal Single Audit Act of 1984 and requirements issued by the federal Office of Management and Budget, the OSA is required to conduct audit work related to compliance with federal requirements for federal awards expended by the State. This includes Recovery Act funds.

The State will continue to receive and spend Recovery Act monies during Fiscal Year 2011, which will also increase the amount of audit work related to federal expenditures for that fiscal year. The OSA budget request for Fiscal Year 2011 will reflect the increase in reappropriated funds needed for that period.

Comments: The OSA has notified the Office of State Planning and Budgeting that this supplemental request for reappropriated funds related to the Recovery Act is being submitted to the Executive Committee of the Legislative Council.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 101 CONCERNING PAYMENT OF EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATIVE 102 DEPARTMENT.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

The amount of reappropriated funds appropriated to the state auditor for state fiscal year 2009-10 is increased by \$130,000 so that the state auditor is authorized to expend funds to be received from various departments for audits conducted as required by the federal "American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009".

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 441, Session Laws of Colorado 2009, is amended to read:

Section 1. Appropriation. In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, to the legislative department of the state of Colorado, the sum of thirty-three million five hundred one thousand eighty-eight dollars (\$33,501,088) THIRTY-THREE MILLION SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-ONE THOUSAND EIGHTY-EIGHT DOLLARS (\$33,631,088), or so much thereof as may be necessary, of which amount thirty-two million four hundred seventy-three thousand six hundred thirty-two dollars (\$32,473,632) shall be out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, two hundred twenty-three thousand six hundred forty dollars (\$223,640) shall be from cash funds, and eight hundred three thousand eight hundred sixteen dollars (\$803,816) NINE HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SIXTEEN DOLLARS (\$933,816) shall be from reappropriated funds, for payment of the expenses of the legislative department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, to be allocated as follows:
