

## Senate Joint Resolution 10-004

This joint resolution is similar to previous joint resolutions dealing with the project eligibility lists for the Drinking Water Revolving Fund and the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund. The Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority, the Water Quality Control Division in the Department of Public Health and Environment and the Division of Local Government in the Department of Local Affairs jointly operate these revolving fund programs.

The joint resolution adds projects, modifies the project description for some of the previously approved projects and deletes projects already completed. The joint resolution covers both the Drinking Water and Water Pollution Control projects.

For 2010 the drinking water project list and the water pollution control project list were developed by the staff of the Water Quality Control Division and reviewed through a public hearing process before the Water Quality Control Commission.

The drinking water portion of this joint resolution adds 85 projects, modifies the project description for 86 projects and deletes 1 project. Upon passage of SJR10-004, the drinking water project eligibility list will contain 390 projects with an identified funding need of over \$2.0 billion.

The water pollution control portion of this joint resolution adds 56 projects, modifies the project description for 75 projects and deletes 14 projects. Upon passage of SJR10-004, the water pollution control project eligibility list will contain 365 projects with an identified funding need of over \$2.84 billion.

### Drinking Water

Under the Base Program through 2009, 116 loans have been executed for \$317 million, including 10 loans for \$12.6 million in 2009.

Under the DWRF ARRA program in 2009, 24 loans have been executed for \$32.3 million.

Loan capacity for 2010 is estimated at \$37.5 million.

### Water Pollution Control

Under the Base Program through 2009, 167 loans have been executed for \$768 million, including 11 loans executed for \$14.0 million in 2009.

Under the WPCRF ARRA program in 2009, 12 loans have been executed for \$28.3 million.

Loan capacity for 2010 is estimated at \$40.3 million.
