Description:

The commission consists of eleven members with at least one voting member from each of the five Commission districts, and four voting members from the public at large, the Commissioner of Agriculture, and the Executive Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or their designees, both of whom shall serve as ex officio nonvoting members. Neither the Commissioner of Agriculture, the Executive Director of the Department of Natural Resources, nor their designees shall be considered as representatives of any political party. No more than two voting members shall be from any one of the five districts; except that one of the at large members may be appointed from any district so that a district may have three voting members. The members of the commission shall be appointed by the Governor, with the consent of the Senate. Members of the commission shall be residents of this state, and each member appointed from a Commission district shall, at the time of the member's appointment and at all times during the member's term of office, be a bona fide resident of the district from which appointed. All members of the commission shall have a reasonable knowledge of wildlife issues, wildlife habitat, or wildlife management. Members shall be removed from office by the governor only for cause.

Terms of office are four years. No member shall serve more than two four-year consecutive terms. Vacancies on the commission shall be filled for the unexpired term by the Governor, with the consent of the Senate. A request for removal of a member shall be submitted to the governor by the secretary of the commission confirming that a member has failed, for reasons other than temporary mental or physical disability or illness, to attend any combination of three regular meetings of the commission or commission workshops during any twelve-month period without the commission having entered upon its minutes an approval for any such absences. The Governor, in his or her discretion, may remove the member.

One member of the commission shall be appointed from each of the following categories: livestock producers, agricultural or produce growers, sportsmen or outfitters, sportsmen or sportswomen, wildlife organizations, and boards of county commissioners. Three members of the commission shall be appointed from the public at large. With the exception of members serving on the commission on January 1, 2000, a member shall serve his or her entire term, and any subsequent term, representing the category for which such member was originally appointed. No more than five members may be from the same political party.

The members of the commission at their annual meeting in March shall elect a chairman, a vice-chairman, and a secretary for one-year terms. The commission shall hold regular meetings in January, March, May, July, September, and November and shall hold commission workshops in February, April, June, August, October, and December and may hold additional meetings at such other times as the commission may deem necessary for the proper transaction of its duties and business. Each commissioner shall hold no less than two public meetings per year in his or her district.
