**TITLE:** CONCERNING ELIMINATION OF THE REQUIREMENT THAT A PERSON EMPLOYED IN A TECHNICAL FORESTRY CAPACITY BY THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM POSSESS AT LEAST TWO YEARS' EXPERIENCE IN FOREST PRACTICE.

### **Summary of Legislation**

This bill eliminates the requirement that persons employed in a technical forestry capacity by the board of governors of the Colorado State University system have at least 2 years experience in forest practice. Employees are still required to have a degree from an accredited school of forestry. The bill was signed by the Governor and became law on March 29, 2010.

### **Assessment**

This bill is assessed at no fiscal impact. It simply reduces the job requirements for a technical forestry position and does not affect board revenues or expenditures.
