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AGRICULTURE, LIVESTOCK, & NATURAL RESOURCES

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

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be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable HB10-1134 recommendation.

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HB10-1159 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

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Amend printed bill, page 2, line 19, strike "LOCATED OR" and substitute "LOCATED,".

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Page 3, line 1, strike "EXCHANGE;" and substitute "EXCHANGE, OR WITHIN WHOSE BOUNDARIES IS LOCATED THE STREAM OR RIVER UPSTREAM OF THE PROPOSED POINT OF DIVERSION;".

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Page 3, strike lines 8 through 10 and substitute:

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"(I) (A) AT LEAST FORTY-FIVE DAYS BEFORE FINALIZING THE 50 MITIGATION AGREEMENT, PROVIDE WRITTEN NOTICE OF THE PROPOSED AGREEMENT TO THE WATER COURT FOR THE DIVISION FROM WHICH WATER WOULD BE DIVERTED, THE DIVISION OF WATER RESOURCES, ALL PERSONS 53 WHO HAVE REQUESTED NOTICE PURSUANT TO SECTION 37-92-308 (6), AND 54 THE LOCAL BASIN ROUNDTABLE CREATED PURSUANT TO SECTION 37-75-104. THE WRITTEN NOTICE SHALL DESCRIBE THE PURPOSE OF THE

56 PROPOSED AGREEMENT AND THE SUBJECTS AND ISSUES INVOLVED.
