(a) Commencing no later than July 1, 2010, the state AUDITOR SHALL UNDERTAKE A STUDY TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE PASSAGE OF THIS SECTION HAS RESULTED IN ANY MEASURABLE REDUCTION OF EMISSIONS OF SULFUR DIOXIDE, NITROUS OXIDE, OR CARBON DIOXIDE IN COLORADO. THE STATE AUDITOR SHALL REPORT THE RESULTS OF SUCH STUDY TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2011.

(b) IF THE STATE AUDITOR REPORTS, PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (8), THAT THERE HAS NOT BEEN A MEASURABLE 14 REDUCTION OF EMISSIONS OF SULFUR DIOXIDE, NITROUS OXIDE, OR CARBON DIOXIDE IN COLORADO SINCE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE SUSPENDED PENDING FURTHER LEGISLATIVE ANALYSIS AND DELIBERATION.".

Amend the Transportation and Energy Committee report, dated February 5, 2010, page 12, after line 26 insert:

"40-2-130. Renewable energy standard - transfer of credits rules - definitions. (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT 53 OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

(a) "BIOMASS THERMAL SYSTEM" MEANS A SYSTEM PRODUCING 56 THERMAL ENERGY USING ANY RAW OR PROCESSED PLANT-DERIVED

1 ORGANIC MATTER AVAILABLE ON A RENEWABLE BASIS, INCLUDING, BUT 2 NOT LIMITED TO, DEDICATED ENERGY CROPS AND TREES; AGRICULTURAL 3 FOOD AND FEED CROPS; AGRICULTURAL CROP WASTES AND RESIDUES; 4 WOOD WASTES AND RESIDUES, INCLUDING LANDSCAPE WASTE, 5 RIGHT-OF-WAY TREE TRIMMINGS, OR SMALL-DIAMETER FOREST THINNINGS 6 THAT ARE TWELVE INCHES IN DIAMETER OR LESS; DEAD AND DOWNED 7 FOREST PRODUCTS; AQUATIC PLANTS; NONNATIVE PHREATOPHYTES; 8 ANIMAL WASTES; OTHER VEGETATIVE WASTE MATERIALS; NONHAZARDOUS PLANT MATTER WASTE MATERIAL THAT IS SEGREGATED FROM OTHER 10 WASTE; FOREST-RELATED RESOURCES, SUCH AS HARVESTING AND MILL 11 RESIDUE, PRE-COMMERCIAL THINNINGS, SLASH, AND BRUSH; 12 MISCELLANEOUS WASTE, SUCH AS WASTE PALLETS, CRATES, AND 13 DUNNAGE; AND RECYCLED PAPER FIBERS THAT ARE NO LONGER SUITABLE 14 FOR RECYCLED PAPER PRODUCTION, BUT NOT INCLUDING PAINTED, 15 TREATED, OR PRESSURIZED WOOD, WOOD CONTAMINATED WITH PLASTICS 16 OR METALS, TIRES, OR RECYCLABLE POST-CONSUMER WASTE PAPER. SUCH 17 SYSTEMS SHALL COMPLY WITH ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY 18 CERTIFICATION PROGRAMS OR SHALL BE PERMITTED BY STATE, COUNTY, 19 OR LOCAL AIR QUALITY AUTHORITIES.

(b) "BTU" MEANS BRITISH THERMAL UNIT.

(c) "BTU RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDIT" MEANS A TRANSFERRABLE CREDIT THAT IS CREATED FOR EACH THREE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED 25 FIFTEEN BTUS OF HEAT PRODUCED BY A BIOMASS THERMAL SYSTEM OR 26 GEOTHERMAL SPACE HEATING AND PROCESS HEATING SYSTEM.

"GEOTHERMAL SPACE HEATING AND PROCESS HEATING SYSTEM" MEANS A SYSTEM THAT USES HEAT FROM WITHIN THE EARTH'S 30 SURFACE FOR SPACE HEATING OR FOR PROCESS HEATING.

THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH A BTU RENEWABLE 33 ENERGY CREDIT PROGRAM TO ALLOW CUSTOMERS WHO USE RENEWABLE 34 ENERGY IN FORMS THAT INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, A BIOMASS 35 THERMAL SYSTEM OR A GEOTHERMAL SPACE HEATING AND PROCESS 36 HEATING SYSTEM, TO CALCULATE THE BTU PRODUCTION AND CONVERT THE BTU PRODUCTION TO A BTU RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDIT.

(3) EACH BTU RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDIT SHALL COUNT AS ONE 40 AND ONE-HALF KILOWATT-HOURS OF RENEWABLE ENERGY, AS SET FORTH 41 IN SECTION 40-2-124 (1) (c) AND (1) (d).

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(4) A CUSTOMER WHO OBTAINS A BTU RENEWABLE ENERGY 44 CREDIT MAY TRANSFER THE CREDIT TO A QUALIFYING RETAIL UTILITY, WHO MAY USE THE CREDIT TOWARD THE RENEWABLE ENERGY REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 40-2-124 (1) (c) AND (1) (d).

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(5) THE COMMISSION SHALL PROMULGATE REASONABLE RULES AS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.".
