- (b) IN COMPLYING WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE "PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY ACT", PART 3 OF THIS ARTICLE, EACH BOARD OF EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION ARE ENCOURAGED TO ALSO POST ON THEIR RESPECTIVE WEB SITES THE BUDGET WITH UPDATED DATA SUBMITTED PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (3).".

Page 6, after line 10, add:

"(2) Notwithstanding any provision of subsection (1) of this section to the contrary, section 3 of this act shall take effect only if House Bill 10-1036 is enacted and becomes law."

owner must remove a multisection mobile home, from the date the notice is served or posted. In those situations where a multisection mobile home is being leased to, or occupied by, persons other than its owner and in a manner contrary to the rules and regulations of the landlord, then, in that event, the tenancy may be terminated by the landlord upon giving a thirty-day notice rather than said sixty-day notice."

Page 6, line 8, strike "NINETY-DAY" and substitute "SIXTY-DAY".

Page 6, line 9, strike "AND".

Page 6, line 10, strike "SUBSECTION (2)".

Page 6, strike lines 16 through 20 and substitute:

- "(4) (a) IF THE TENANCY IS TERMINATED DUE TO A CHANGE IN USE, THE LANDLORD SHALL PROVIDE COMPENSATION TO THE HOME OWNER AS FOLLOWS:
- (I) IF THE HOME OWNER IS UNABLE TO MOVE THE MOBILE HOME DUE TO THE PERMANENT OR SEMIPERMANENT NATURE OF THE HOME, THE LANDLORD SHALL PROVIDE COMPENSATION TO THE HOME OWNER FOR THE FAIR MARKET VALUE OF THE HOME; OR
- (II) IF THE HOME OWNER IS READILY ABLE TO MOVE THE MOBILE HOME DUE TO THE MOBILE NATURE OF THE HOME, THE LANDLORD SHALL COMPENSATE THE HOME OWNER FOR ANY EXPENSES THE HOME OWNER INCURS IN MOVING THE HOME; EXCEPT THAT THE LANDLORD SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO COMPENSATE THE HOME OWNER FOR ANY EXPENSES ABOVE AND BEYOND THE FAIR MARKET VALUE OF THE HOME. - (b) If a Landlord terminates a tenancy as described in Paragraph (a) of this subsection (4), the notice required by section 38-12-204.3 shall include a section advising the home owner of the compensation required by this subsection (4).".
