- (c) By September 15, 2010, each city, city and county, and county shall close all medical marijuana centers and optional premises cultivation operations within its boundaries that have not applied for a license pursuant to paragraph (b) of this subsection (1) and certify to the state licensing authority created in section 12-43.3-201 that it has done so. To effect uate this paragraph (c), the state licensing authority shall provide, upon request, to a city, city and county, or county, a list that includes the name and location of each license applicant that applied for a state license pursuant to paragraph (b) of this subsection (1). If a city, city and county, or county fails to comply with this paragraph (c), the state licensing authority shall not process any applications from that city, city and county, or county."

FIRST REPORT OF FIRST CONFERENCE COMMITTEE ON HJR10-1015

THIS REPORT AMENDS THE REVISED JOINT RESOLUTION

To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:
