"Eligible employee" includes a retiree of the association who is serving in a state elected official's position but does not include any other retiree of the association or a retiree of the association who has suspended benefits.
- (II) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (a), ON AND AFTER JANUARY 1, 2011, FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PART 15, "ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEE" MEANS AN EMPLOYEE WHO BEGAN EMPLOYMENT FOR AN EMPLOYER, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 24-51-101 (20), ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2011; EXCEPT THAT NOT MORE THAN TEN PERCENT OF EMPLOYEES IN ANY DIVISION OF THE ASSOCIATION WHO BEGAN EMPLOYMENT FOR AN EMPLOYER, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 24-51-101 (20), ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2011, SHALL BE ALLOWED TO MAKE THE ELECTION FOR ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES PURSUANT TO THIS PART 15.".
