NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, NO LATER THAN MAY 15, 2010, THE COMMISSION SHALL TRANSMIT, OR CAUSE TO BE TRANSMITTED, ALL MONEYS FROM THE HIGH COST SUPPORT MECHANISM, NOT TO EXCEED TWO MILLION THREE HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS, INTO THE FUND.

- (II) THIS PARAGRAPH (d) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2011.
- (e) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (3) TO THE CONTRARY, ON JULY 1, 2010, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL DEDUCT FROM THE FUND TWO MILLION THREE HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS AND TRANSFER SUCH AMOUNT TO THE GENERAL FUND.
