SB10-205 by Senator(s) Bacon, Scheffel; also Representative(s) **Scanlan** and **Murray**--Concerning the authority of a school district to submit to the eligible electors of the district the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness for the purpose of paying costs that may be paid from the general fund of the school district.

SB10-207 by Senator(s) Johnston and Romer; also Representative(s) **Tyler** and **Levy**--Concerning authorization for the state treasurer to enter into lease-purchase agreements on behalf of the state to finance capital construction projects proposed by the governor's energy office that improve the energy efficiency of state capital facilities, and making an appropriation in connection therewith.
