Dear Reapportionment Commission Members:

The state reapportionment process for Colorado is an important exercise that ensures all Coloradoans' voices are heard fairly and evenly in the Colorado General Assembly. For the last decade, the city of Longmont has been split between two state house districts, being represented in districts 11 and 12. In addition, rural areas around Longmont are included in another two districts. We ask the commission to carefully consider the City of Longmont when deciding on state house district boundaries for the next decade.

The Longmont Area Chamber of Commerce does not support candidates for office, and is actually prohibited from doing so per our by-laws. However, we recognize the importance of smart business policy and regularly call upon our elected officials to vote on legislation that we trust will further economic prosperity for our city and state.

We believe that our voice in the Colorado House of Representatives could be heard more evenly and fairly with one district more exclusive to Longmont. Until the recent election of Longmont resident Deb Gardner in 2010, Longmont a city of over 86,000 persons, did not have a city resident in the Colorado House of Representatives.

In addition, our voice is shared with the communities of Boulder, Lafayette and Louisville. Rural areas around Longmont share a district with communities as far away as Idaho Springs and Georgetown. Not one current house district represents a unified Longmont voice.

We understand that the population of Longmont prohibits us from having a sole district seat. However, a quick look at two other northern Colorado cities larger than Longmont, Fort Collins and Greeley finds that both are represented by multiple seats but each has a district almost exclusive to their city or immediate environs. We request commission members adhere to the spirit of Colorado law and recognize the City of Longmont as a community of geographic, cultural and economic interest and that the house districts for our area be as contiguous and compact as possible.

Dear Committee Members,

The Littleton City Council has not taken a position on reapportionment of Colorado House and Senate districts. However I would like to bring some information to the Committee's attention as it considers district boundaries.

Although Littleton is in three counties the vast majority of Littleton is located in Arapahoe County; there are only 71 registered Littleton voters in Douglas County and approximately 800 Littleton homes in Jefferson County, leaving the remaining 18,000 Littleton homes in Arapahoe County.

Littleton has a long historical relationship with Arapahoe County. Littleton was the first county seat of modern Arapahoe County. The historic Arapahoe County courthouse is located in Littleton. Many of the county offices are located in Littleton, and the county commissioners meet at the county offices located immediately north of the Littleton City Center.

Many of the residents living to the east of Littleton in what is now the City of Centennial considered themselves to be Littleton residents and have a strong community of interest with Littleton residents. While this is also true for many residents living to the west of Littleton in unincorporated Jefferson County, Littleton has more in common with its eastern neighbors than its western neighbors: the western border of Littleton pretty much follows the western border of Arapahoe County, Littleton Public School District's western boundary stops at the western boundary of Littleton, and South Suburban Park and Recreation District's western boundary also is defined by the western boundary of Littleton.

I currently serve as Mayor of Greenwood Village. Our City Council decided that each member of the council should express their own preference as to redistricting status of the Colorado General Assembly.

I urge you to maintain the City of Greenwood Village in the 38th House District.

Keeping the City of Greenwood Village in the 38<sup>th</sup> House District will maintain a "community of interest," that has grown stronger decade after decade since the founding of the City of Greenwood Village 60 years ago.

A community of interest for the purpose of legislative redistricting is commonly defined as "a contiguous population which shares common social and economic interests that should be included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation."

We believe that the City of Greenwood Village is a poster child for the aforementioned definition given the following examples:

Our intertwined activities with Arapahoe County include providing us social services, housing our prisoners and elections services;

Greenwood Village shares a common connection with Littleton and is served in part by the Littleton Fire Department and Littleton School District;

Greenwood Village is an integral part of the 18<sup>th</sup> Judicial District which includes all of Arapahoe, Douglas, Lincoln and Elbert counties;

Our Arts and Humanities scholarship program is one example of our tremendous interaction with both the Cherry Creek Schools District and Littleton Public Schools, both of which are solely within Arapahoe County;

The annual Fitness Festival held in Greenwood Village supports the Cherry Creek Schools Foundation which serves several south side cities;



Arapahoe Library District provides total library services to the City;

Southeast Business Partnership, an economic development engine, includes not only business leaders located in Greenwood Village but also both Arapahoe and Douglas Counties, Centennial, and Lone Tree.

Please keep us a part of the 38th House District.

#### Honorable Commission Members:

My name is Tamyla McMahan, and I live in HD 12. I am writing to ask you to consider restoring Longmont to its 2001 boundaries. Currently, our Representatives come from either Louisville/Lafayette or north Boulder. As the last census indicates that Longmont's population is around 90,000, it is entirely appropriate for Longmont to comprise its own HD, instead of sharing lines with Boulder, Lafayette, or Louisville.

Our needs, desires, and values, are different from those of people who are located in the areas mentioned above, they should have their own representation, as should the people of Longmont. I live near Centennial Park; and neither I, nor my neighbors have much in common with the people that live near Louisville's Coal Creek Golf Course. Yet, we share the same representation.

According to the state constitutional criteria for a district:

"The area within a district must be as compact as possible and the sum of the perimeters of all districts must be as short as possible".

"Districts must be composed of contiguous election precincts."

"Counties and cities cannot be split unless necessary to achieve equal population."

And finally, the criteria state that "communities of interest — ethnic, economic, cultural, demographic, trade area and geographic — are to be preserved within a single district whenever possible."

If these criteria are considered, then Longmont, with a population of 90,000, should be comprised of a single HD. We should not share a district with areas that are comprised of a different community of interest than the community of Longmont.

RE: Concerns Regarding Proposed Move of Grand County Out of House District 57

Dear Mr. Carrera and Commission Members,

Please accept this letter written on behalf of the Winter Park Town Council as our request to keep all of Grand County together with other Western Slope communities. It is our belief that the reapportionment plan currently being discussed — which would move Grand County into a district with portions of Larimer or Boulder Counties — does not combine communities with shared interests and dilutes our voices here in Winter Park.

Grand County does not share any cultural, economic, or physical ties with either Larimer or Boulder Counties. As you know, our economic interests rely on a mixture of winter sports, tourism, and some agricultural interests. These same economic characteristics can barely be found on the Front Range, and we do not have any commerce with these communities on these grounds. Further, there are no physical connections (i.e. roads) that consistently connect Grand County with these other communities, and year-round access to either Larimer or Boulder County is difficult to establish, at best.

Cultural differences abound between Grand and Larimer or Boulder Counties. Grand County residents identify with the Western Slope, and are often at odds with a variety of Front Range interests (water, to name one). We compete with certain communities in Larimer County for business in Rocky Mountain National Park, and any representative from this new district will not be able to effectively represent these competing interests. Further, Grand County's voice will be significantly diluted due to the greater population base being on the other side of the Continental Divide, effectively giving us no voice at all.

We greatly appreciate your consideration of our concerns regarding the reapportionment of Grand County, and we hope that you will consider keeping Grand County affiliated with other Western Slope communities in which we share common interests, such as those currently in House District 57.

The leadership of both the Democratic and Republican Parties of Grand County are united in opposing any plan to lump Grand County into Larimer County. In a bi-partisan manner, both political parties oppose any plan that makes the low-population Grand County politically subservient to any of the more populous Front Range counties.

One of the many reasons why Grand County and Larimer County should not be in the same political district is because it is extremely difficult and, at times, impossible in winter to travel by road between Grand and Larimer Counties.

As soon as the snows begin to fall, US 34, AKA Trail Ridge Road, that runs over Rocky Mountain National Park between Grand Lake and Estes Park, is closed to vehicular traffic. Typically, US 34 remains closed until Memorial Day or, as it was this year, even later.

Moreover, in the winter, Cameron Pass on Highway 14, is often closed and is only plowed during daylight hours. Therefore, for much of the winter, it is not possible to drive north from Grand County to Larimer County via Highway 14 or US 34.

There is, however, a way to reach Larimer County by driving north from Grand County across Jackson County and then to Laramie, Wyoming. From Laramie, Wyoming, one can use US 287 to re-enter Colorado and then drive south to reach the Red Feather Lakes area in northern Larimer County.

Alternatively, if Berthoud Pass at the south end of Grand County is open and not shut down for avalanche control or large boulder removal (as it was at least seven times this winter), one can drive down through Clear Creek County to US 40 to Interstate 70 and into Gilpin or Jefferson County, then turn north and drive through Boulder County and finally reach the southern border of Larimer County -- a trip of about four hours.

Does it make sense to connect two counties politically when for many months of the year the citizens of the two counties cannot reach each other by road without driving into Wyoming or by enduring a four-hour road trip through three other counties?

In your deliberations, please consider the twin realities of geography and Colorado's winter weather.

As a long time resident of Grand County, Colorado I would ask that you reconsider rearranging the state House districts to include Grand County with the Front Range. There are many reasons not to include Grand County with Larimer, Garfield or Boulder counties.

- 1. The west slope is a totally different demographic mix than the Front Range. As a small county of only 13,000 residents we are for the most part small business owners with four or less employees—not the large companies and organizations of the east slope. Our businesses are those of outdoor recreation which is very dissimilar from those of the Counties you are moving us to.
- 2. With only 13,000 residents in Grand County as opposed to the almost 300,000 residents of Larimer County, we would never be able to make our needs and desires known through the voting process. Any representative would vote with their constituents having larger numbers of voters.
- 3. Grand County is currently involved in litigation against water users in the Front Range counties that, if this reapportionment is approved, would throw us into the lion's den.
