A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE REGULATION OF TOBACCO.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

For the purpose of existing provisions addressing the furnishing of cigarettes or tobacco products to minors, the use of cigarettes or tobacco products by a minor, and the use of cigarettes or tobacco products on school property, the bill expands the definition of "tobacco product" to include any device that is designed to deliver inhaled, ingested, or physically applied doses of nicotine.

For the purpose of taxation, "tobacco product" is redefined to

include any device that is designed to deliver inhaled, ingested, or physically applied doses of nicotine; except that "tobacco product" does not include cigarettes, which are taxed separately.

The bill extends the repeal date of the statutes concerning the regulation of tobacco sales to minors from July 1, 2011, to July 1, 2016.

6	(I) Any product that contains or is derived from tobacco and is
7	intended to be ingested or inhaled by or applied to the skin of an

13	SUBSECTION (5) TO THE CONTRARY, "tobacco product" does not mean any
14	product that the food and drug administration of the United States
15	department of health and human services has approved as a tobacco use

2	special account. (1) The general assembly finds that many of the
3	schools in this state permit the use of tobacco PRODUCTS in and around
4	school property. The general assembly further finds that secondhand
5	smoke generated by such activity and the negative example set and
6	frequently imitated by our school children are detrimental to the health
7	and well-being of such children as well as to school teachers, staff, and
8	visitors. Accordingly, the general assembly finds and declares that it is
9	appropriate to create a safe and healthy school environment by prohibiting
10	the use of tobacco products on all school property.
11	SECTION 4. 39-28.5-101 (5), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
12	amended to read:
13	39-28.5-101. Definitions. As used in this article, unless the
14	context otherwise requires:
15	(5) "Tobacco products" means cigars, cheroots, stogies, periques,
16	granulated, plug cut, crimp cut, ready rubbed, and other smoking tobacco,
17	snuff, snuff flour, cavendish, plug and twist tobacco, fine-cut and other
18	chewing tobaccos, shorts, refuse scraps, clippings, cuttings and sweepings
19	of tobacco, and other kinds and forms of tobacco, prepared in such
20	manner as to be suitable for chewing or for smoking in a pipe or
21	otherwise, or both for chewing and smoking, but does not include
22	cigarettes which are taxed separately pursuant to article 28 of this title
23	PRODUCT" SHALL HAVE THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH IN SECTION
24	18-13-121, C.R.S.; EXCEPT THAT "TOBACCO PRODUCT" DOES NOT INCLUDE
25	CIGARETTES, WHICH ARE TAXED SEPARATELY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 28
26	OF THIS TITLE.
