A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING AN EXPANSION OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES IN WHICH A
102	COURT MAY ORDER FURTHER RESTRICTIONS AS CONDITIONS OF
103	A PROTECTION ORDER AGAINST A DEFENDANT.

Bill Summary

Current law allows a court to issue protection orders in domestic violence cases with the added restrictions against the defendant concerning the presence at particular locations, contact with victims, possession of firearms, possession of alcohol, or any other restriction that

the court deems appropriate to protect the safety of the alleged victim. The bill expands the types of criminal cases for which a court can impose these added restrictions to all of the crimes that are subject to the victims' rights act.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** The introductory portion to 18-1-1001 (3), Colorado 3 Revised Statutes, is amended to read: 4 **18-1-1001. Protection order against defendant.** (3) Nothing in 5 this section shall preclude the defendant from applying to the court at any 6 time for modification or dismissal of the protection order issued pursuant 7 to this section or the district attorney from applying to the court at any 8 time for further orders, additional provisions under the protection order, 9 or modification or dismissal of the same. The trial court shall retain 10 jurisdiction to enforce, modify, or dismiss the protection order until final 11 disposition of the action. Upon motion of the district attorney, or on the 12 court's motion to protect the alleged victim, the court may, in cases 13 involving domestic violence as defined in section 18-6-800.3 (1) AND 14 CASES INVOLVING CRIMES LISTED IN SECTION 24-4.1-302, C.R.S., enter any 15 of the following further orders against the defendant: 16 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, 17 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 18 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
