1 **REPORT(S) OF COMMITTEE(S) OF REFERENCE** 2 3 **AGRICULTURE, LIVESTOCK, & NATURAL RESOURCES** After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the 4 5 following: 6 7 <u>HB12-1278</u> be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to 8 the Committee on Appropriations with favorable 9 recommendation: 10 11 Amend printed bill, strike everything below the enacting clause and 12 substitute: 13 **"SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly hereby declares that: 14 15 (a) In 1966, the general assembly commissioned a study of the interaction between the South Platte alluvial aquifer and the surface flows 16 in the South Platte river. The general assembly considered this study in 17 passing the "Water Right Determination and Administration Act of 18 1969", article 92 of title 37, Colorado Revised Statutes, and augmentation 19 20 plans authorized by the 1969 act are operating on a large scale in the 21 South Platte river basin. Many scientific and technological advances have 22 occurred since the study was completed in 1968, yet no comprehensive 23 study has been conducted since then regarding the impact of alluvial groundwater usage on the South Platte river or the relative success of 24 augmentation plans authorized by the 1969 act in protecting senior 25 26 surface water diverters and maximizing the use of both groundwater and surface waters of the state. The general assembly finds that the South 27 Platte alluvial aquifer plays a critical role in the state's economy, that 28 29 development of this aquifer is and will continue to be an important water 30 supply source, and that it is appropriate at this time to engage in an 31 additional study on these matters. 32 (b) Groundwater levels in some areas of the South Platte river 33 alluvium have risen since 2005 to unprecedented high levels and have caused damaging conditions, including crop damage, decreased soil 34 35 productivity, salt accumulation in soils, deterioration of water quality, failures of wastewater systems and infrastructure, damage to residential 36 37 and commercial property, increased nonbeneficial consumptive use by 38 phreatophytes, water waste, and significant outflow to Nebraska; and 39 (c) Because of the critical roles that the South Platte river and its 40 alluvial aquifer play in supporting the state's economy, the Colorado 41 water conservation board, beginning in 2012 and in consultation with the 42 state engineer and the Colorado water institute, must conduct comprehensive studies of the available historical hydrologic data through 43 44 water year 2011 to evaluate the effectiveness of the "Water Right Determination and Administration Act of 1969" in achieving the dual 45 goals of protecting senior water rights and maximizing the beneficial use 46 47 of both surface waters and groundwaters of the state. 48 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 37-60-115, add (7) 49 as follows: 50 **37-60-115.** Water studies - rules - repeal. (7) South Platte 51 river alluvial aquifer study - study authorized. (a) THE BOARD SHALL, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE ENGINEER AND THE COLORADO WATER 52 53 INSTITUTE, ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 23-31-801, C.R.S., AND ALSO REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "INSTITUTE", CONDUCT A 54 55 COMPREHENSIVE STUDY TO COMPILE AND EVALUATE AVAILABLE 56 HISTORICAL HYDROLOGIC DATA THROUGH WATER YEAR 2011. THE 1 STUDY'S OBJECTIVES ARE:

7 (II) TO IDENTIFY AND DELINEATE AREAS WITHIN THE BASIN 8 ADVERSELY IMPACTED BY HIGH GROUNDWATER LEVELS AND TO CONDUCT 9 A FEASIBILITY-LEVEL EVALUATION OF THE CAUSES OF HIGH 10 GROUNDWATER LEVELS IN THE AFFECTED AREAS;

(III) TO PROVIDE INFORMATION TO USE AS A BASIS FOR
 IMPLEMENTATION OF MEASURES TO MITIGATE ADVERSE IMPACTS IN AREAS
 EXPERIENCING HIGH GROUNDWATER LEVELS; AND
