REPORTS FROM THE HOUSE ETHICS COMMITTEE

February 14, 2012

Dear Mr. Speaker:

Please be advised that the Ethics Committee you appointed pursuant to House Rule 49 has now met to consider the Complaint filed against Representative Laura Bradford. The Ethics Committee met on February 6 and February 10, 2012. Minutes of the discussions and actions taken at those meetings, along with the evidentiary information compiled by the Committee, are maintained by the Legislative Council staff and may be reviewed at that office.

In conducting its preliminary investigation, the Ethics Committee limited its focus to the issues framed in the Complaint, dated January 31, 2012, concerning: (1) Whether, on January 25, 2012, Representative Bradford was driving under the influence of alcohol or while her abilities were impaired, in violation of section 42-4-1301 (a) or (b), C.R.S., and, if so, whether her misconduct involved her legislative duties in a manner to warrant action under House Rule 49; and (2) whether, on January 25, 2012, Representative Bradford invoked legislative privilege against arrest, either expressly or implicitly, and was granted such privilege, thereby avoiding further investigation of her level of intoxication and further potential charges under the Colorado Revised Statutes and, if so, whether the invocation or acceptance of legislative privilege, under the facts and circumstances, constituted misconduct involving her legislative duties in a manner to warrant action under House Rule 49.

The Committee recognizes that in holding public office, the members of the General Assembly are entrusted with the public's trust and, therefore, are held to a higher standard of conduct consistent with the public's expectations. However, the Committee finds that it has no evidence to support a finding that Representative Bradford was driving under the influence or while her abilities were impaired on January 25, 2012. The Committee further finds, based upon the press conference held by the Denver Police Department on January 31, 2012, clarifying the events of January 25, 2012, that Representative Bradford did not invoke legislative privilege and, in fact, on at least two occasions asked to be treated like any other person in that situation.

Accordingly, the Committee determines that no probable cause exists to find that an ethics violation occurred. The Committee finds that no further action is required of this Committee and hereby dissolves itself in the discharge of its

1 duties. It is the understanding of the Ethics Committee that, upon making these
2 findings, the Complaint is dismissed pursuant to House Rule 49 (c).

16 We, the undersigned members of the Ethics Committee you appointed pursuant
17 to House Rule 49 regarding the Complaint filed against Representative Laura
18 Bradford, respectfully submit this Minority Report. While we agree with the
19 statements set forth in the first and second paragraphs of the Majority Report,
20 as well as the conclusion that no probable cause exists to find that an ethics
21 violation occurred, we herein submit our separate findings based upon the
22 evidence, and lack of evidence, available to the Committee in its preliminary
23 investigation under the rule.

24

25 We find that the Denver Police Department did not administer a breathalyzer
26 test or obtain a blood sample to test for Representative Bradford's blood alcohol
27 content. Therefore, the undersigned believe that the Committee was not able to
28 make a determination as to whether Representative Bradford was driving under
29 the influence or while her abilities were impaired on January 25, 2012. The
30 undersigned also find that, because of an internal investigation by the Denver
31 Police Department, the Committee was not able to investigate fully whether
32 Representative Bradford invoked legislative privilege. Therefore, the
33 Committee's investigation was limited to information already in the public
34 record. Based on the evidence available, namely the press conference held by
35 the Denver Police Department on January 31, 2012, clarifying the events of
36 January 25, 2012, we cannot find that Representative Bradford did invoke
37 legislative privilege.

38

39 Our ethical obligations require us to do more than just obey the law. The
40 Committee recognized that in holding public office, the members of the General
41 Assembly are entrusted with the public's trust and, therefore, are held to a
42 higher standard of conduct consistent with the public's expectations.
43 Nevertheless, based on the investigation that the Committee was able to
44 conduct, the Committee determined, and we agree, that no probable cause exists
45 to find that an ethics violation occurred.
