30 Each public school shall assist each student and his or her parent or legal
31 guardian to develop and maintain the student's individual career and
32 academic plan no later than the beginning of ninth grade but may assist
33 the student and his or her parent or legal guardian to develop and
34 maintain the student's individual career and academic plan in any grade
35 prior to ninth grade. AT A MINIMUM, EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL SHALL ENSURE
36 THAT, IN DEVELOPING AND MAINTAINING EACH STUDENT'S INDIVIDUAL
37 CAREER AND ACADEMIC PLAN, THE COUNSELOR OR TEACHER EXPLAINS TO

9 institute charter school shall assist each student and his or her parent or
10 legal guardian to develop and maintain the student's individual career and
11 academic plan no later than the beginning of ninth grade but may assist
12 the student and his or her parent or legal guardian to develop and
13 maintain the student's individual career and academic plan in any grade
14 prior to ninth grade. AT A MINIMUM, EACH INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL
15 SHALL ENSURE THAT, IN DEVELOPING AND MAINTAINING EACH STUDENT'S
16 INDIVIDUAL CAREER AND ACADEMIC PLAN, THE COUNSELOR OR TEACHER
