The office shall administer the grant program as provided in this article and pursuant to policies adopted 32 33 by the office. 34 35 (2) (a) The governor's COLORADO energy office shall adopt policies specifying when a qualified school may request a grant and the 37 procedure for making the request. 38 39 **SECTION 7.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-89-105, amend (1), (2) (a), (2) (b) introductory portion, and (3) as follows: 41 42 22-89-105. Wind for schools grant program - policies awarding grants. (1) The governor's COLORADO energy office shall adopt policies for the implementation of the wind for schools grant 45 program. At a minimum, the policies shall specify the procedures for 46 applying for a grant, the form of the grant application, the information to 47 be provided by the applicant, and the criteria for awarding grants. 48 49 (2) (a) The governor's COLORADO energy office shall review each 50

grant application received from a qualified school pursuant to section 22-89-104 and shall make a determination as to whether the grant should 52 be awarded and, except as provided in paragraph (c) of this subsection (2), the amount of the grant. If the office determines an application is 54 missing any information required by the office's policy to be included 55 with the application, the office may contact the applicant to obtain the 56 missing information.
