



Voter Service Center Options – Denver Elections Division

Registered voter with a mail ballot.




The voter inserts their ballot into a locked ballot box and receives an "I Voted" sticker.



OR

The voter submits their ballot at a drive through drop-off into a locked ballot box and receives an "I Voted" sticker.




OR

The voter submits their ballot at a secured ballot drop box available 24 hours/day, seven days/week.




OR


The voter may surrender their ballot and vote on a ADA accessible voting machine.

Voter approaches Service Counter.




Voter fills out a Colorado Voter Service Center Replacement Form indicating the need for a replacement.




OR

Voter surrenders the damaged ballot and any components of the mail ballot packet they have brought.




OR

The voter is issued a mail ballot packet to take home or a flat ballot or DRE to vote at the VSC. Voter's who vote at the VSC sign a Blue Voter Card and go to a voting booth.




OR

The voter either places their ballot in the locked ballot box or submits their vote choices on the DRE machine.




Registered voter who has never received a mail ballot at their home.



Voter approaches Service Counter.




Voter fills out a Colorado Voter Service Center Form, updating their address.




OR

The address is updated, and the voter is issued a mail ballot packet to take home or a flat ballot or DRE to vote at the VSC. Voter's who vote at the VSC sign a Blue Voter Card and go to a voting booth.

The voter is issued either a flat ballot or DRE Voting Card.




The voter either places their ballot in the locked ballot box or submits their vote choices on the DRE machine.



Voter who would like to vote on an ADA accessible machine




Voter approaches Service Counter.




OR

If the voter has a mail ballot, they will surrender the ballot. If not, they will fill out a Voter Service Center form to update their address, with help from an Election Judge if necessary.




OR

The voter's information is updated and they are issued a DRE Voting Card.

The voter inserts the DRE Voting Card into the DRE machine, and can utilize the machine's audio and visual accessibility features to vote.




OR


The voter either places their ballot in the locked ballot box or submits their vote choices on the DRE machine.



Unregistered Voter




Voter approaches Service Counter.





Voter fills out a Colorado Voter Service Center Form.




OR
