53 Your first conference committee appointed on HB13-1130,
54 concerning extended operation of interruptible water supply agreements,
55 has met and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

1 That the House accede to the Senate amendments made to the bill,
2 as the amendments appear in the rerevised bill, with the following

6 "and" and substitute "(2) and (3) (c);".

30 SHALL PUBLISH THE RESUMES IN THE MANNER SET FORTH IN SECTION
31 37-92-302 (3) (a) AND (3) (b), NOTWITHSTANDING THE FACT THAT THE
32 APPLICATIONS WERE FILED WITH THE STATE ENGINEER;

33 (II) FILE PROOF OF THE SUBMISSION OF THE RESUME TO THE WATER
34 CLERK WITH THE STATE ENGINEER NOT LATER THAN TEN DAYS AFTER THE
35 SUBMISSION; AND

36 (III) FILE PROOF OF THE NOTICE TO ALL PARTIES WHO HAVE
37 SUBSCRIBED TO THE SUBSTITUTE WATER SUPPLY PLAN NOTIFICATION LIST,
38 AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 37-92-308 (6), WITH THE STATE ENGINEER
39 WITHIN TEN DAYS AFTER PROVIDING THE NOTICE.

40 (d) OWNERS OF WATER RIGHTS HAVE UNTIL THE LAST DAY OF THE
41 FOURTH MONTH FOLLOWING THE MONTH IN WHICH THE RESUME WAS
42 SUBMITTED TO THE WATER CLERK TO FILE COMMENTS ON THE OPERATION
43 OF THE INTERRUPTIBLE WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT."
