Dear Honorable Members of the House of Representatives

My presentation: I would like to speak in favor of HB1271

My interest: I am the Director of the Colorado School for Family Therapy founded in 1995. The School is a Private Occupational School regulated and approved by the State of Colorado Department of Higher Education Division of Private Occupational Schools (DPOS) for the education of mental health professionals (CRS 12-59). I also served as a Professional Member and Vice Chair of the Professional Counselors Examiners Board (2005-2006); as the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Representative on the State of Colorado Commission for Criminal and Juvenile Justice (CCJJ) (2007-2012); as an expert witness for DORA and the Attorney General's Office (2006 and 2009); and a member of the DORA MFT Professional Development Standards Committee (2010). I have educated hundreds of addiction counseling candidates throughout the State and our graduates have been elected leadership of professional organizations and appointed to DORA regulatory boards. I am also the President and Founder of the multidisciplinary professional organization: The Colorado Mental Health Professionals Association (COMHPA). Also, my School office in Aurora is only about 3 miles from the Aurora Theatre shooting and family members of my students were severe impacted by this horrible act of violence.

My testimony: HB1271 needs to be enacted into law for 3 simple reasons:

- 1.) Public Safety and Protection of the Public: Innocent Colorado citizens need to be protected from the violent acts of persons who are mentally ill or criminally motivated. A clear statutory provision of a duty to warn and a duty to protect would serve that purpose.
- 2.) Limitation of Liability for Mental Health Professionals: A clear statutory duty to warn and duty to protect would limit the liability of helping professions who exercise such duty to protect innocent Colorado citizens from such homicidal acts.
- 3.) Basis for Intervention to Help Clients: Mental Health Professionals will have a clear legal basis to seek further professional help for potentially violent clients prior to perpetration of such violent acts.
