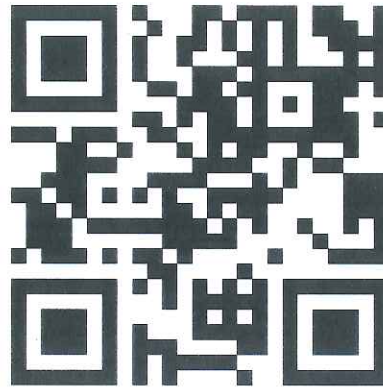

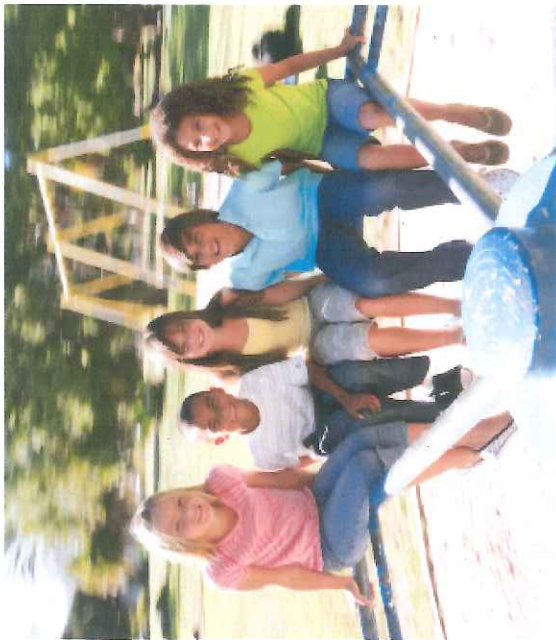

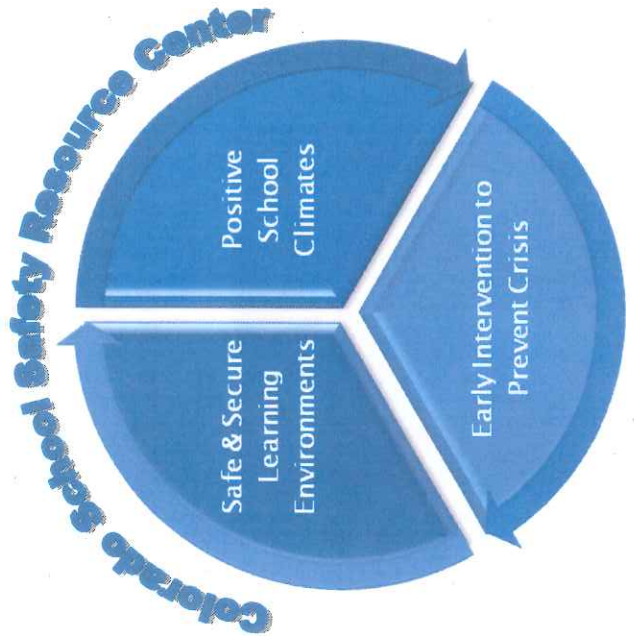

Highlights from 2013

- * New Emergency Response Outreach Consultant position created in SB13-138
- * Expanded electronic capabilities:
 - ◆ 7,628 ListServ members
 - ◆ New Live Stream capabilities reaching 1,261 people
 - ◆ Increased online courses to five
- * Training milestones:
 - ◆ 17 Topic-Centered Trainings
 - ◆ Adult Sexual Misconduct
 - ◆ Positive School Climate
 - ◆ Proactive Discipline Approaches
 - ◆ Threat Assessment in Schools
 - ◆ Youth Substance Abuse Prevention
 - ◆ Youth Suicide Prevention & Intervention
