Zebulon Pike's significance to the State of Colorado is extensive. He was a Brigadier General in the United States Army, and the explorer whose expedition first documented what came to be known as Pikes Peak. Upon his return, Pike fought and died in the Battle of York; which the United States won.¹ Pikes Peak is one of the most well-known and most visited peaks in Colorado.²

This piece is significant to Colorado due to its artist. Graham Witherspoon, a 93-year-old Navy veteran and constituent of Senate President Morgan Carroll, is Colorado's oldest college student – studying at the Community College of Aurora. He has been active in his local community for decades. Mr. Witherspoon gave this piece to the State of Colorado with the hopes of it being shown publically in the Capitol, and because he wanted to give something back to the state that means so much to him.
