THE BATTLE FOR IWO JIMA.

ON FEB, 19, 1945, THE BATTLE FOR IWO JIMA BEGAN. THE ISLAND, SOME 4 MILES LONG AND $1\frac{1}{2}$ MILES WIDE AT THE WIDEST POINT, IS FEATURED BY 556 FOOT MT. SURIBACHI AT ITS' SOUTHERNMOST POINT.

20,000 JAPANESE COMMANDED BY GENERAL TADAMICHI KURIBAYASHI ALL BUT A FEW DIED IN BATTLE. 6,821 AMERICANS, MOSTLY MARINES, WERE KILLED IN BATTLE. MARCH 14, 1945, THE ISLAND WAS PROCLAIMED SECURE, BUT SPORADIC EVENTS OCCURRED THEREAFTER.

ONE OF THE MOST FAMOUS PHOTOGRAPHS OF WWII WAS THE FLAG RAISING ON MT. SURIBACHI TAKEN BY PHOTOGRAPHER, JOE ROSENTHAL. TWO MOVIES...., "FLAGS OF OUR FATHERS" AND "LETTERS FROM IWO JIMA" DEPICTED THE INTENSITY AND CARNAGE OF THIS BATTLE. THE FIRST MOVIE WAS FROM THE AMERICAN VIEW AND THE SECOND FROM THE JAPANESE.

A NAVY OFFICER WHOSE SHIP WAS FROM EARLY APRIL 1945, A STATION VESSEL AT IWO JIMA HAS USED HIS LATTER DAY ARTISTIC TALLENTS TO PORTRAY THE HISTORIC FLAG RAISING.

The War was over. Three Naval Officers took their dates to the Fairmont Hotel in San Francisco for dinner and dancing.



He firmly believes that "Old sailors never die, they just keep on sailing".

Celestial Navigation. (prior to GPS) was essential for ship's at sea. Angles and Time were the determinates. The Navigator, sextamt in hand, would sight upon celestial objects (stars, planets, sun., and moon) and shout "Mark!" for the benefit of the Quartermaster (whose watch was in sync with the ship's cronometer) The Quartermaster would then record angle of the object and time of sighting. The Navigator would then take these sightings to the Navigation Room to calculate location from lines of position of these various celestial objects.
