Bill Summary

In response to the September 2013 flood, the bill creates a flood

debris cleanup grant account in the flood and drought response fund for the purpose of allowing the Colorado Water Conservation Board to make grants to help pay the costs of watershed cleanup in areas affected by the flood. The bill appropriates \$5,000,000 for implementation of the grant program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 37-60-123.2

37-60-123.2. Flood and drought response fund - flood debris cleanup grant account - created. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the flood and drought response fund, referred to in this section as the "response fund". The state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer three hundred thousand dollars from the Colorado water conservation board construction fund to the response fund. The board is authorized to provide funding for flood and drought preparedness and for response and recovery activities following flood or drought events and disasters. The moneys in the response fund are hereby continuously appropriated to the board for flood and drought response purposes, including the immediate availability of funds for aerial photography of flooded areas, flood and drought documentation and identification of specific hazards, evaluations and revisions of floodplain designations and drought-prone areas, flood and drought forecasting and preparation, and development of disaster and recovery mitigation plans. The state treasurer shall credit all interest derived from the investment of moneys in the response fund to the Colorado water conservation board construction fund. Any balance remaining in the response fund at the end of any fiscal year remains in the fund.

(2) (a) THERE IS HEREBY CREATED THE FLOOD DEBRIS CLEANUP

- (b) The moneys in the flood debris account are Continuously appropriated to the Colorado water conservation Board for grant-making purposes in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subsection (2). All interest earned from the investment of moneys in the flood debris account is credited to the flood debris account. Any moneys not expended at the end of the fiscal year remain in the flood debris account and do not
- 15 (c) Upon the effective date of this subsection (2), the state 16 treasurer shall transfer from the general fund to the flood 17 debris account the sum of five million dollars.

REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND OR ANY OTHER FUND.

- 18 (d) This subsection (2) is repealed, effective July 1, 2015.
- SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
