HOUSE COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE AMENDMENT

Committee on Legislative Council.SB14-153 be amended as follows:

1 Amend reengrossed bill, page 14, after line 21 insert:

2 "SECTION 30. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-303.3, amend
3 (1) introductory portion, (2), and (3) (a) as follows:4 **2-3-303.3. Interim committees.** (1) Commencing on and after
5 the effective date of this section, interim committees may not be
6 requested by a legislative member by bill or resolution. No later than ~~the~~
7 ~~ninety-fourth~~ A day CERTAIN of a regular legislative session AS
8 ESTABLISHED IN THE JOINT RULES OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF
9 REPRESENTATIVES, a legislative member may submit a request in writing
10 to the legislative council created in section 2-3-301 (1) regarding an issue
11 that he or she wishes to study during the next interim between sessions.
12 At minimum, the request must specify:13 (2) No later than ~~the one hundredth~~ A day CERTAIN of a regular
14 legislative session AS ESTABLISHED IN THE JOINT RULES OF THE SENATE
15 AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, the director of research of the
16 legislative council shall determine the number of interim committee
17 meetings that may be held within the legislative budget and shall provide
18 that information to the executive committee of the legislative council.19 (3) (a) No later than ~~the one hundred eighth~~ A day CERTAIN of a
20 regular legislative session AS ESTABLISHED IN THE JOINT RULES OF THE
21 SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, the legislative council shall
22 meet to review and prioritize requests made by legislative members
23 pursuant to subsection (1) of this section. Such review and prioritization
24 must take into account the information provided by the director of
25 research of the legislative council as specified in subsection (2) of this
26 section. The legislative council shall also determine if any of the
27 prioritized interim committees may create a task force. If a task force is
28 approved, such task force shall include no more than two legislative
29 members, one from the majority party and one from the minority party of
30 the interim committee. Legislative members on a task force are only
31 entitled to receive necessary travel costs and are not entitled to per diem
32 pursuant to section 2-2-307. For purposes of carrying out the task force's
33 duties, the legislative council may accept and expend money, gifts, grants,
34 donations, services, and in-kind donations from any public or private
35 entity for any direct or indirect costs associated with the duties of the task
36 force; except that the legislative council may not accept money, gifts,
37 grants, donations, services, or in-kind donations if acceptance is subject

1 to conditions that are inconsistent with state law or requires a
2 predetermined conclusion or result from the task force. The legislative
3 council shall request that the entity offering the money, gift, grant,
4 donation, services, or in-kind donation submit a letter prior to the offer
5 specifying the amount of money, gift, grant, or donation offered, or the
6 estimated value of the services or in-kind donation offered, the period for
7 which the money, gift, grant, donation, services, or in-kind donation is
8 available, and the specific purposes for which the money, gift, grant,
9 donation, services, or in-kind donation is to be used."

10 Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

11 Page 15, line 25, strike "This act applies" and substitute "Sections 1
12 through 29 of this act apply".

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
