

Helping Formerly Incarcerated Men and Women Transition to Lives of Success and Fulfillment

The purpose of the Work And Gain Education And Employment Skills (WAGEES) project is to improve the employment prospects of young adult released prisoners and high school dropouts living in high-poverty, high-crime communities. The WAGEES project prepares and increases the employment rate of participants, decreases the recidivism rate of young offenders served, increases the rate at which participants receive high school diplomas and industry-recognized credentials as well as increase the rate at which participants enter post-secondary education and training. The Latino Coalition is the national intermediary for the project that is fully funded by the U.S. Department of Labor Employment & Training Administration.

IT Takes A Village/Second Chance Center (ITAV/SCC) was awarded a 12-month grant of \$200,000 to serve 75 participants and due to their strong performance, were recently awarded an additional grant to continue services through March 31, 2015. The primary focus is on current and ex-offenders (minimum of 60%) between the ages of 18-24. Since the start of the project on April 1, 2013 ITAV/SCC has proved to be a very active site and is ahead of enrollment projections. To date, 110 participants have been enrolled into the WAGEES Project which is a 146% above goal. The Latino Coalition's Director of Operations stated that, "The Second Chance Center team is one the highest performing organizations in the entire project. Their ability to connect, hold account and engage these young people in meaningful activities is impressive. The bottom line is that Second Chance Center is an effective and efficient organization that helps participants move on from and stay out of prison".

ITAV/SCC provides an array of services directly or through established service providers. Case managers are responsible for outreach, intake, enrollment, development of and individual service plan, resource and referral as well as tracking participant activities, progress and outcomes in a web-based data system.

As of date of this report, 71 participants have achieved an outcome prescribed by the Department of Labor. Participants have access to vocation training classes were credentials from OSHA and the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) and the International Polytechnic Institute will be issued to participants. A major focus for this population is employment, which is reflected in the participation and outcomes regarding training and employment services.

Recidivism is another important measure that is applies to ex-offenders who have been released from prison in the previous 12 months from the date of enrollment into the WAGEES project who were re-arrested for a new crime or had their probation/parole revoked and were re-incarcerated. The Project considers participants who are in half-ways houses as incarcerated.

The WAGEES Project collects data to help inform the program design and gain an understanding of the Participants being served. Some interesting facts regarding all 110 of the Participants in ITAV/SCC include:

- 77% are Male, 23% are female.
- 79% of Participants are Current or Ex-Offenders from the Adult System, 3% are from the Juvenile System and 18% are Non-Offender High School Dropouts.
- 45% of the Participants enrolled do not have a High School Diploma or GED.
- 52% are first time offenders and 31% are repeat offenders.
- 19% are Violent Offenders, 44% are non-violent offenders, 24% are non-violent drug/substance abuse offenders.
- 72% of Participants do not have an active driver's license.
- 28% of Participants report stable house, 58% report temporary housing and 14% are homeless.
- 18% report a learning, physical or mental disability.
- 54% report not having insurance and 11% are unsure.
- The top 3 items Participants report needing legal help with are (1) Restoring a driver's license (20%), (2) Outstanding Warrants or fines (5.5%), and (3) Determining what to disclose on job application (4.5%)
- The top 3 referral sources for the WAGEES Program are (1) Participants/Friend (44%), (2) Denver District Court Adult Probation Department (27%) and (3) Denver Community Corrections (19%).
- There are 70 children that have a parent in the WAGEES Program.










