1 exceed seven hundred fifty thousand dollars. If ANY AMOUNT OF
 2 unexpended and unencumbered moneys remaining in the fund at the end
 3 of a budget year ~~exceed~~ THAT EXCEEDS seven hundred fifty thousand
 4 dollars or the limit set pursuant to paragraph (d) of this subsection (1), IS
 5 CONTINUOUSLY APPROPRIATED TO the institute, AND THE INSTITUTE shall
 6 allocate the excess amount to the institute charter schools on a per-pupil
 7 basis by dividing the excess amount by the total pupil enrollment of the
 8 institute charter schools for the applicable budget year. The state treasurer
 9 shall ensure that any unexpended and unencumbered moneys that are in
 10 the fund at the end of a budget year up to seven hundred fifty thousand
 11 dollars or the limit set pursuant to paragraph (d) of this subsection (1)
 12 remain in the fund and are not credited or transferred to the general fund
 13 or another fund.

14 **SECTION 25.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1210, **amend**
 15 **as amended by House Bill 14-1292** (1) (d) (I) as follows:

16 **22-7-1210. Early literacy fund - created - repeal.** (1) The early
 17 literacy fund is hereby created in the state treasury and is referred to in
 18 this section as the "fund". The fund shall consist of:

19 (d) (I) For the 2013-14 budget year, an amount equal to sixteen
 20 million dollars from the state education fund, and for the 2014-15 budget
 21 year, and each budget year thereafter, an amount equal to ~~thirty-six~~
 22 THIRTY-FOUR million dollars from the state education fund. On July 1,
 23 2013, and on July 1 each year thereafter, the state treasurer shall transfer
 24 the appropriate amount from the state education fund to the early literacy
 25 fund.

26 **SECTION 26.** In House Bill 14-1292, section 21, **amend** (2) as
 27 follows:

28 Section 21. **Appropriation - adjustments to 2014 long bill.**

29 (2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated,
 30 out of any moneys in the early literacy fund created in section 22-7-1210
 31 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, to the
 32 department of education, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the
 33 sum of ~~\$20,000,000~~ \$18,000,000, or so much thereof as may be
 34 necessary, to be allocated to the early literacy program for early literacy
 35 program per pupil intervention funding. Said sum is from moneys
 36 transferred from the state education fund created in section 17 (4) (a) of
 37 article IX of the state constitution pursuant to section 22-7-1210 (1) (d)
 38 (I), Colorado Revised Statutes.

39 **SECTION 27.** In Senate Bill 14-150, **amend** section 5 as follows:

40 Section 5. **Appropriation.** In addition to any other appropriation,
 41 there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the state education
 42 fund created in section 17 (4) (a) of article IX of the state constitution, not
 43 otherwise appropriated, to the department of education, for the fiscal year
 44 beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of ~~\$5,000,000~~ \$3,000,000 and 1.0 FTE,
 45 or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to the school
 46 counselor corps grant program for the implementation of this act.

47 **SECTION 28. Appropriation - adjustments to 2014 long bill.**

48 (1) For the implementation of this act, appropriations made in the annual
 49 general appropriation act to the department of education for the fiscal
 50 year beginning July 1, 2014, are adjusted as follows:

51 (a) The cash funds appropriation from the state education fund
 52 created in section 17 (4) (a) of article IX of the state constitution, for the
 53 state share of districts' total program funding, is decreased by
 54 \$30,384,050.

55 (b) The cash funds appropriation from the state public school fund
 56 created in section 22-54-114 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, for the state

1 share of districts' total program funding, is increased by \$30,384,050,
2 which amount is from federal mineral leasing revenues transferred to the
3 state public school fund pursuant to sections 22-54-114 (1) and
4 34-63-102, Colorado Revised Statutes."

50 (d) IN ADDITION, TWENTY-TWO PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPORTED

23 OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES, A CHARTER SCHOOL AUTHORIZED BY A
24 SCHOOL DISTRICT PURSUANT TO PART 1 OF ARTICLE 30.5 OF THIS TITLE, OR
25 A CHARTER SCHOOL AUTHORIZED BY THE STATE CHARTER SCHOOL
26 INSTITUTE PURSUANT TO PART 5 OF ARTICLE 30.5 OF THIS TITLE.

27 (3) "SCHOOL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL" MEANS A STATE-LICENSED
28 OR STATE-CERTIFIED SCHOOL NURSE OR OTHER STATE-LICENSED OR
29 STATE-CERTIFIED HEALTH PROFESSIONAL QUALIFIED UNDER STATE LAW TO
30 PROVIDE SUPPORT SERVICES TO CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS.

31 (4) "SECONDARY SCHOOL" MEANS A PUBLIC SCHOOL THAT
32 INCLUDES ANY OF GRADES SEVEN THROUGH TWELVE.

33 (5) "STATE BOARD" MEANS THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION
