27 **SECTION 11. Effective date.** This act takes effect upon passage;
28 except that section 35-61-106 (3) (a) (III), Colorado Revised Statutes, as
29 enacted by section 6 of this act and section 9 of this act only take effect
30 if Senate Bill 14-215 does not pass, and section 35-61-106 (3) (a) (IV) as
31 enacted by section 6 of this act and section 10 of this act only take effect
32 if Senate Bill 14-215 is enacted and becomes law."
