9 STATE REINTRODUCING BLACK-FOOTED FERRETS UNDER THIS SECTION.

10 (II) THE DIVISION SHALL ADMINISTER THIS SUBSECTION (f) BY:

11 (A) TRACKING THE NUMBER OF POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS THAT ARE  
12 AUTHORIZED TO RELEASE BLACK-FOOTED FERRETS UNDER THIS SECTION;  
13 AND

14 (B) DENYING CERTIFICATION TO A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE  
15 STATE IF CERTIFICATION WOULD RESULT IN MORE THAN THREE POLITICAL  
16 SUBDIVISIONS INTRODUCING BLACK-FOOTED FERRETS UNDER THIS  
17 SECTION.

18 (III) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019."
