20 the Committee of the Whole with favorable
21 recommendation:

23 Amend the Finance Committee Report, dated March 12, 2014, page 3,
24 line 24, after "**treasurer.**" insert "(a)".

26 Page 3, line 31, after "YEAR." add "THE REIMBURSEMENT SHALL BE PAID
27 FROM THE STATE GENERAL FUND."

29 Page 3, after line 31 insert:

31 "(b) THE TRANSFERS FROM THE GENERAL FUND THAT ARE
32 REQUIRED BY PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (4) SHALL BE
33 INCLUDED FOR INFORMATIONAL PURPOSES IN THE ANNUAL GENERAL
34 APPROPRIATION ACT FOR THE PURPOSE OF COMPLYING WITH THE
35 LIMITATION ON STATE FISCAL YEAR SPENDING IMPOSED BY SECTION 20 OF
36 ARTICLE X OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION AND SECTION 24-77-103,
37 C.R.S."

39 Page 4 of the report, after line 18 insert:

41 **"SECTION 2. Appropriation - adjustments to 2014 long bill.**

42 (1) For the implementation of this act, the general fund appropriation
43 made in the annual general appropriation act to the controlled
44 maintenance trust fund created in section 24-75-302.5 (2) (a), Colorado
45 Revised Statutes, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, is decreased
46 by \$2,221,828.

47 (2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby
48 appropriated, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise
49 appropriated, to the department of treasury, for the fiscal year beginning
50 July 1, 2014, the sum of \$2,221,828, or so much thereof as may be
51 necessary, for reimbursement to county treasurers pursuant to section 39-
52 1-123 (4), Colorado Revised Statutes, related to the implementation of
53 this act."
