24 This is to inform you that I will neither sign nor veto House Bill
25 14-1371, "Concerning Property Taxation of Oil and Gas Leaseholds and
26 Lands, and, in Connection Therewith, Specifying that the Wellhead is The
27 Point of Valuation and Taxation for Such Leaseholds and Lands."
28 Therefore, this bill will become law at 12:01 a.m. on August 6, 2014. This
29 letter sets forth my reasons for allowing this bill to become law without
30 my signature.
31

32 Under recent interpretations of the law, the production value from
33 oil and gas leases located in more than one property taxing jurisdiction is,
34 for property tax purposes, allocated between the jurisdictions in
35 proportion to the surface acreage of the lease within each district's
36 boundaries. House Bill 14-1371 simplifies this process, and specifies
37 instead that the wellhead is the point of valuation and taxation for
38 property tax purposes. This simplification is consistent with the personal
39 property and severance tax treatment of oil and gas interests. The bill
40 passed through both chambers of the General Assembly with a total of
41 only three 'no' votes.
42

43 Since its passage, however, we have heard from certain
44 stakeholders that the bill should be vetoed because it changes a "long-
45 standing" principle of taxation, creating tax winners and losers. We have
46 even heard from legislators who voted for the bill who are now having
47 second thoughts. We recognize that changing methods of allocating
48 property tax revenues can have significant financial impacts to local
49 jurisdictions, and we are sympathetic to the jurisdictions whose property
50 tax revenue will be reallocated.
51

52 Notwithstanding our public policy concerns about this bill, it is the
53 Colorado General Assembly that has the duty and power to craft
54 Colorado's laws, and House Bill 14-1371 had overwhelming legislative
55 support. As a matter of good government, when carefully crafted
56 legislation that simplifies the tax code passes with near unanimous

1 support, that legislation should be allowed to become law. We take the
2 veto power very seriously, and view it as more than simply a last chance
3 opportunity for a legislative do-over. The veto power should be exercised
4 judiciously and carefully: to protect essential state interests, to guard
5 against legislative overreach, and to protect the core rights and freedoms
6 of all Coloradoans.

7
8 For these reasons, I am allowing House Bill 14-1371 to become
9 law without my signature. We are hopeful that members of the General
10 Assembly will engage interested stakeholders in a dialogue about the
11 effects of the bill's implementation.

35 This is to inform you that at 4:29 p.m. today, I vetoed House Bill
36 14-1375, "Concerning Modifications to Statutory Provisions Governing
37 Urban Redevelopment to Promote the Equitable Financial Contribution
38 Among Affected Public Bodies in Connection with the Tax Increment
39 Financing of Urban Redevelopment Projects." This letter sets forth my
40 reasons for vetoing the legislation. The bill and this letter are being filed
41 today with the Secretary of State in accordance with Article IV, Section
42 11 of the Colorado Constitution.

43
44 After considering the views of proponents and opponents of the
45 legislation, we came to understand that both sides have legitimate
46 arguments. As Governor, I understand that we seek a balance to address
47 the concerns of all sides while also maintaining the viability of
48 mechanisms such as tax increment financing to address blight and
49 encourage responsible development that supports business and creates
50 jobs. Urban renewal authorities and tax increment financing are important
51 tools that have facilitated transformative projects and stimulated
52 employment opportunities across the state.

53
54 We believe, however, that counties and affected local governments
55 are entitled to a greater say in the urban renewal process, and that
56 widening the tax base for urban renewal projects is an important goal. We

1 support HB 14-1375's provisions that increase this transparency by
2 giving counties a seat on urban renewal boards, ensuring that affected
3 local governments are able to participate in the redevelopment process,
4 and clarifying that remaining increment revenues should be distributed
5 pro rata following repayment of bonds and other outstanding obligations.
6

7 Unfortunately, HB 14-1375 goes a step too far. The bill's provision
8 that mandates the percentage of allocated property tax increment not
9 exceed the percentage of allocated municipal sales tax increment does not
10 account for the complexity and variety of urban renewal projects. We
11 understand the concerns that such inflexibility could hamstring projects
12 that might benefit from the use of these programs. Moreover, unresolved
13 technical issues were identified in the bill that could lead to significant
14 financial constraints for municipalities. Each urban renewal project is
15 both geographically and financially unique. Land use planners, urban
16 renewal authorities and affected communities should have flexibility to
17 address blight in the manner that best meets each community's specific
18 needs and goals.
19

20 We strongly encourage the affected stakeholders, along with the
21 General Assembly, to work together to craft a bipartisan, compromise
22 solution that better balances the concerns of all parties. A suitable
23 compromise would establish an equitable method for widening the tax
24 base that supports tax increment financing and increase the role and
25 participation of counties and affected local governments in the urban
26 renewal process; all while maintaining the flexibility to develop projects
27 that are focused on addressing the particular needs of a given community.
28 We stand ready to work with counties, municipalities, local governments,
29 business leaders and land use professionals toward developing a
30 consensus solution.
