31 We are returning to the General Assembly House Bill 14-1108, "Concerning Limits
32 on Copayments Made by a Covered Person for Physical Rehabilitation Services."
33

34 I vetoed this bill as of 9:16AM today. This letter sets forth my reasons for vetoing this
35 legislation.
36

37 We share the General Assembly's desire to improve Coloradans' access to physical
38 rehabilitation services, but we find that House Bill 14-1108 achieves this goal by
39 unduly jeopardizing affordability of healthcare coverage for many Coloradans.
40

41 We deeply value the services provided by physical therapists, occupational therapists,
42 chiropractors, acupuncturists, and massage therapists, and our decision regarding this
43 legislation is not a reflection on these professions or the services they provide.
44

45 Recent significant reforms to Colorado's health insurance market require that
46 rehabilitation services are covered benefits in all new individual and small group
47 policies. Colo. Rev. Stat. § 10-16-102(22)(b)(X). While this includes physical,
48 occupational, and speech therapy, it does not expressly include or exclude
49 acupuncture, chiropractic services, and massage therapy. Additionally, insurance
50 companies must not set rates based on an individual's health status, but rather based
51 on the projected health care costs of the community, and plans offered must meet fixed
52 tiers for cost sharing that clearly lay out what proportion of total health costs will be
53 covered by the insurance plan. Colo. Rev. Stat § 10-16-105; 10-16-107. Finally, both
54 federal and state law prohibit insurers from discriminating against providers due to
55 their license classification, as long as the providers are acting within the scope of their
56 authority. 42 U.S.C § 300gg-5; Colo. Rev. Stat. § 10-16-107.7.

1 Consumers currently have the choice of selecting a plan with varying levels of
2 premiums. These include some with higher out-of-pocket costs at the time of service,
3 or others that offer a higher premium, but decreased cost-sharing when individuals
4 seek care. Through the transparency afforded by Connect for Health Colorado, our
5 state-based insurance exchange, consumers can compare plans side-by-side and select
6 which one best meets their needs. While consumers' out-of-pocket costs would likely
7 be lower when they seek care from the providers encompassed by this legislation, all
8 insured consumers will be required to pay higher premiums to cover the additional
9 costs to the system.

10
11 Unfortunately, this legislation creates a market imbalance which may discourage use
12 of providers outside the scope of this law and fuel anti-competitive practices. In
13 addition, it puts unnecessary restrictions on cost sharing for services provided by
14 physical therapists, occupational therapists, chiropractors, acupuncturists, and massage
15 therapists, which limits insurers' ability to appropriately manage costs and services
16 within their health insurance products.

17
18 There has been significant public attention in Colorado to the cost of health insurance
19 in recent months, and additional concern that rising costs of health care are driving
20 insurance premiums higher than many Coloradans can afford. In partnership with the
21 private and nonprofit sectors, our administration has made a commitment for Colorado
22 to become the healthiest state in the nation, embodied in a report entitled *The State of*
23 *Health*, which we issued in May 2013. One key component of that commitment is
24 ensuring Coloradans have access to affordable health insurance coverage.

25
26 To keep affordable coverage within the reach of Colorado families, we must make
27 tough choices about new requirements that will raise insurance premiums, and we are
28 concerned with the precedent-setting effects of this legislation. Although physical
29 rehabilitation can often result in cost avoidance within the healthcare system and cost
30 savings to patients when accessed as a preventive measure, the evidence cannot be
31 generalized across all treatments and services offered by a specific profession or
32 provider type. This legislation is not about the quality or value of services being
33 provided to patients and consumers, but rather about contract restrictions between the
34 insurance carrier and a subset of providers.

35
36 We appreciate and share the General Assembly's enthusiasm for improving access to
37 healthcare services, and we are committed to working with Members and other
38 stakeholders to ensure Coloradans have access to quality, affordable healthcare. We
39 believe House Bill 14-1108 unnecessarily deprives consumers of choice and sacrifices
40 affordability because of its mandatory requirements on cost-sharing.

41
42 Accordingly, I have vetoed this bill.
