16       (III) TOWERS WITHIN A SKI AREA BOUNDARY;  
17       (IV) WIND-POWERED ELECTRICAL GENERATORS WITH A ROTOR  
18 BLADE RADIUS GREATER THAN SIX FEET; OR  
19       (V) STREET LIGHTS ERECTED OR MAINTAINED BY THE  
20 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.  
21       (b) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (4),  
22 THIS SECTION APPLIES TO TOWERS OR POLES WITH A PRIMARY PURPOSE OF
