IF A THIRD TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY APPLIES FOR A PERMIT BEFORE THE PERMIT FEE HAS BEEN READJUSTED FOR THE FIRST TIME UNDER SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION, THE TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY SHALL PAY A PERMIT FEE OF SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN DOLLARS AND THE TWO OTHER PERMIT HOLDERS SHALL EACH BE REFUNDED ONE-HALF OF THE PERMIT FEE PAID BY THE THIRD PERMIT HOLDER. IF A FOURTH TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY APPLIES FOR A PERMIT FEE BEFORE THE PERMIT FEE HAS BEEN READJUSTED FOR THE FIRST TIME UNDER SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION, THAT TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY SHALL PAY A PERMIT FEE OF FIFTY-THREE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS AND THE THREE OTHER PERMIT HOLDERS SHALL EACH BE REFUNDED ONE-THIRD OF THE PERMIT FEE PAID BY THE FOURTH PERMIT HOLDER. FOR A FIFTH OR SUBSEQUENT TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY SEEKING A PERMIT BEFORE THE PERMIT FEE HAS BEEN READJUSTED FOR THE FIRST TIME UNDER SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION, THE COMMISSION SHALL SET THE FEE BY DETERMINING THE TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY'S PRO RATA SHARE OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS AND SHALL REFUND TO THE OTHER PERMIT HOLDERS A PRO RATA SHARE OF THE TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY'S PERMIT FEE.

(4) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, AT EACH REGULAR SESSION, SHALL DETERMINE THE COMMISSION'S ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES FOR REGULATING TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES UNDER THIS PART 6, INCLUDING ANY FTE ADDITIONS OR REDUCTIONS THAT MAY BE NECESSARY. THE COMMISSION SHALL ASSESS PERMIT FEES IN AMOUNTS THAT, IN THE AGGREGATE, EQUAL THE COMMISSION'S ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES, AS DETERMINED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY. THE COMMISSION SHALL ASSESS A PERMIT FEE AGAINST EACH TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY OPERATING IN COLORADO IN AN AMOUNT APPORTIONED ON THE BASIS OF THE NUMBER OF PERSONAL VEHICLES ASSOCIATED WITH THE TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY.

(5) THE CUMULATIVE AMOUNT OF THE ANNUAL PERMIT FEES FOR ALL TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES OPERATING IN COLORADO

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MUST NOT EXCEED TWO HUNDRED FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS UNLESS THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DETERMINES THAT AN INCREASED AGGREGATE AMOUNT IS NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE.

(6) THE COMMISSION SHALL DETERMINE THE FORM AND MANNER OF APPLICATION FOR A TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY PERMIT."

(1) It is the duty of the board to promote the conservation of the waters of the state of Colorado in order to secure the greatest utilization of such waters and the utmost prevention of floods; and in particular, and without limiting the general character of this section, the board has the power and it is its duty: 62
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(u) (I) TO ADOPT AND UPDATE, AS WARRANTED, A STATE WATER PLAN. IN EXERCISING ITS AUTHORITY PURSUANT TO THIS PARAGRAPH (u), 68
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EXECUTIVE ORDER D2013-005, OR ANY ANALOGOUS SUCCESSOR ORDER DIRECTING THE BOARD TO ADOPT OR AMEND A STATE OR COLORADO WATER PLAN, THE BOARD SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL REQUIREMENTS OF THIS PARAGRAPH (u).

(II) **Legislative declaration.** BECAUSE THE CONSTITUTION VESTS ALL LEGISLATIVE POWER OF THE STATE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

(A) FINDS THAT THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF A STATE WATER PLAN IS TO DETERMINE STATE POLICY REGARDING THE OPTIMAL CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT OF COLORADO'S WATER RESOURCES;

(B) DETERMINES THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IS PRIMARILY RESPONSIBLE FOR GUIDING THE DEVELOPMENT OF STATE WATER POLICY; AND

(C) DECLARES THAT ENACTMENT OF THIS PARAGRAPH (u) IS NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE INTERESTS OF THE PUBLIC IN THE STATE'S WATER RESOURCES AND THAT IN ENACTING THIS PARAGRAPH (u), THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY INTENDS TO ENGAGE THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE IN A PUBLIC DIALOGUE REGARDING OPTIMUM STATE WATER POLICY; AFFIRM ITS DELEGATION OF POLICY-MAKING AUTHORITY TO THE COLORADO WATER CONSERVATION BOARD, SUBJECT TO DIRECTION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY; AND NOT INTERFERE WITH, BUT INSTEAD TO PROMOTE THE POLICIES, PROCESSES, BASIN ROUNDTABLE PLANS, AND INTERBASIN COMPACT NEGOTIATIONS CONDUCTED PURSUANT TO THE "COLORADO WATER FOR THE 21ST CENTURY ACT", ARTICLE 75 OF THIS TITLE, AND THE INTERBASIN COMPACT CHARTER AS APPROVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ACTING BY BILL AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 37-75-105 (2).

(III) IN EXERCISING ITS AUTHORITY PURSUANT TO THIS PARAGRAPH (u), THE BOARD SHALL:

(A) DEVELOP THE STATE WATER PLAN WITH THE INVOLVEMENT OF THE PUBLIC AND THE BASIN ROUNDTABLES, AS CREATED IN SECTION 37-75-104 (3) (b), AND PROVIDE OPPORTUNITIES FOR PUBLIC COMMENT BEFORE ADOPTING ANY FINAL OR SIGNIFICANTLY AMENDED PLAN;

(B) PRESENT THE SCOPE, FUNDAMENTAL APPROACH, AND BASIC ELEMENTS OF THE PLAN TO THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE CREATED IN SECTION 37-98-102 BY AUGUST 1, 2014;

(C) IN DEVELOPING THE DRAFT PLAN, CONSIDER THE FEEDBACK FROM THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD PURSUANT TO SECTION 37-98-103 (5) (a) BY NOVEMBER 1, 2014;

(D) PRESENT THE DRAFT PLAN TO THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE BY JULY 1, 2015;

(E) IN DEVELOPING THE FINAL PLAN, CONSIDER THE FEEDBACK FROM THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE SUBMITTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 37-98-103 (5) (b) BY NOVEMBER 1, 2015; AND

(F) NOTIFY THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE OF ANY PROPOSED SIGNIFICANT AMENDMENTS TO THE PLAN, AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD, BY JUNE 1 OF ANY YEAR IN WHICH THE AMENDMENT IS PROPOSED TO BE ADOPTED; PRESENT THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE COMMITTEE BY AUGUST 1 OF THAT YEAR; AND CONSIDER THE COMMITTEE'S FEEDBACK SUBMITTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 37-98-103 (5) (c) BY NOVEMBER 1 OF THAT YEAR.

(IV) BY NOVEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR FOLLOWING THE SUBMISSION TO THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE OF A STATE WATER PLAN OR AMENDMENT PURSUANT TO THIS PARAGRAPH (u), ANY MEMBER OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY MAKE A REQUEST IN WRITING TO THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE THAT THE COMMITTEE HOLD ONE OR MORE HEARINGS TO REVIEW THE PLAN OR AMENDMENT AS SUBMITTED TO THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE. A BILL RECOMMENDED BY THE COMMITTEE FOR CONSIDERATION UNDER THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (IV) DOES NOT COUNT AGAINST THE NUMBER OF BILLS TO WHICH EITHER THE COMMITTEE OR THE MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ARE LIMITED BY LAW OR JOINT RULE OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND A HEARING HELD BY THE COMMITTEE PURSUANT TO THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (IV) DOES NOT COUNT AGAINST THE NUMBER OF MEETINGS ALLOWED BY SECTION 37-98-102 (1)

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(a). (V) A STATE WATER PLAN, WHETHER OR NOT THE SUBJECT OF A BILL INTRODUCED PURSUANT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (IV) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (u), IS ONLY A POLICY, IS NOT A RULE, DOES NOT HAVE THE FORCE OR EFFECT OF LAW, AND IS NOT APPEALABLE TO ANY JUDICIAL ENTITY.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 37-98-101, **amend** (1) introductory portion as follows:

37-98-101. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that the purpose of this article is to provide an interim committee as a forum through which the general assembly shall review the STATEWIDE PLANNING, administration, and monitoring of Colorado's water resources. The general assembly further recognizes the need to ensure that water issues receive sufficient legislative scrutiny and public input:

(5) (a) WHEN THE COLORADO WATER CONSERVATION BOARD SUBMITS THE SCOPE, FUNDAMENTAL APPROACH, AND BASIC ELEMENTS OF A DRAFT STATE WATER PLAN TO THE COMMITTEE AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 37-60-106 (1) (u) (III) (B), THE COMMITTEE SHALL HOLD AT LEAST ONE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE SCOPE, FUNDAMENTAL APPROACH, AND BASIC ELEMENTS OF THE DRAFT PLAN IN EACH GEOGRAPHIC REGION ASSOCIATED WITH THE BASIN ROUNDTABLES, AS CREATED IN SECTION 37-75-104 (3) (b), FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECEIVING THE PUBLIC'S FEEDBACK. THE COMMITTEE SHALL PROVIDE A SUMMARY OF THE PUBLIC'S FEEDBACK, AS WELL AS THE COMMITTEE'S OWN FEEDBACK, TO THE BOARD BY NOVEMBER 1, 2014.

(b) WHEN THE COLORADO WATER CONSERVATION BOARD SUBMITS A DRAFT STATE WATER PLAN TO THE COMMITTEE AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 37-60-106 (1) (u) (III) (D), THE COMMITTEE SHALL HOLD AT LEAST ONE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE DRAFT PLAN IN EACH GEOGRAPHIC REGION ASSOCIATED WITH THE BASIN ROUNDTABLES FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECEIVING THE PUBLIC'S FEEDBACK. THE COMMITTEE SHALL PROVIDE A SUMMARY OF THE PUBLIC'S FEEDBACK, AS WELL AS THE COMMITTEE'S OWN FEEDBACK, TO THE BOARD BY NOVEMBER 1, 2015.

(c) WHEN THE COLORADO WATER CONSERVATION BOARD SUBMITS A SIGNIFICANT AMENDMENT TO THE STATE WATER PLAN TO THE COMMITTEE AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 37-60-106 (1) (u) (III) (F), THE COMMITTEE MAY HOLD AT LEAST ONE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE AMENDMENT IN EACH GEOGRAPHIC REGION ASSOCIATED WITH THE BASIN ROUNDTABLES FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECEIVING THE PUBLIC'S FEEDBACK. IF THE COMMITTEE HOLDS THE HEARINGS, THE COMMITTEE SHALL PROVIDE A SUMMARY OF THE PUBLIC'S FEEDBACK, AS WELL AS THE COMMITTEE'S OWN FEEDBACK, TO THE BOARD BY NOVEMBER 1 OF THE YEAR IN WHICH THE HEARINGS ARE HELD.

(d) HEARINGS HELD PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (5) DO NOT COUNT AGAINST THE NUMBER OF MEETINGS OR FIELD TRIPS ALLOWED BY SECTION 37-98-102 (1) (a).

(6) NO LATER THAN NOVEMBER 1, 2017, AND NO LATER THAN EVERY FIVE YEARS THEREAFTER, THE COMMITTEE SHALL PREPARE A LIST OF SPECIFIC TOPICS THAT IT DEEMS NECESSARY TO BE ADDRESSED IN THE STATE WATER PLAN, AS UPDATED OR AMENDED PURSUANT TO SECTION 37-60-106 (1) (u). THE COLORADO WATER CONSERVATION BOARD SHALL PROVIDE ITS RECOMMENDATIONS, INCLUDING SUGGESTIONS FOR POTENTIAL LEGISLATION, FOR THE COMMITTEE'S CONSIDERATION WITHIN EIGHT MONTHS AFTER RECEIPT OF THE LIST OF SPECIFIC TOPICS.

SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety."
