"SECTION 29. Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the department of state cash fund created in section 24-21-104 (3) (b), Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of state, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$150,154, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be allocated for the implementation of this act as follows:

(a) \$132,720 to information technology services for information

technology costs; and

(b) \$17,434 to the elections division, operating expenses, for voter registration materials.

SECTION 30. Appropriation - adjustments to 2014 long bill. (1) For the implementation of this act, the general fund appropriation made in the annual general appropriation act to the controlled maintenance trust fund created in section 24-75-302.5 (2) (a), Colorado Revised Statutes, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, is decreased by \$30,000.

(2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the general fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of revenue, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$30,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be allocated to the division of motor vehicles, driver services, operating expenses, for modifications to the voter registration system related to the implementation of this act.

SECTION 31. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 17-18-111 as follows:

- 17-18-111. Appropriation to comply with section 2-2-703 SB 14-161 repeal. (1) Pursuant to Section 2-2-703, C.R.S., the following statutory appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are made in order to implement Senate Bill 14-161, enacted in 2014:
- (a) For the fiscal year beginning July 1,2015, in addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated to the department, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty-one thousand four hundred eighty-four dollars (\$21,484).
- (c) For the fiscal year beginning July 1,2016, in addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated to the department, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of nineteen thousand six hundred forty dollars (\$19,640).
 - (2) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2017.".
