




**STATE OF THE STATES:
WHERE ARE WE NOW?
BORN-ALIVE INFANT PROTECTION (BAIPA)**



-  Twenty-six states have laws creating a specific affirmative duty for physicians to provide medical care and treatment to born-alive infants at any stage of development: AL, AZ, CA, DE, FL, GA, IL, IN, KS, LA, ME, MI, MS, MO, MT, NE, NY, OK, PA, RI, SC, SD, TN, TX, WA, and WI.
-  Three states have laws creating a specific affirmative duty for physicians to provide medical care and treatment to born-alive infants after viability: IA, MN, and ND.
-  One state protects born-alive infants at any stage of development from “deliberate acts” undertaken by a physician that result in the death of the infant: VA.
