Dear Representative McCann,

On behalf of the Emergency Medical Services Association of Colorado, I am writing to ask for your support on HB 15-1151, Floor for Medicaid Provider Rates by Representative Rankin and Senator Lambert. We believe this legislation is critical to the financial viability of our state's emergency medical service (EMS) agencies.

EMS is an essential community service—the third leg of public safety. Throughout Colorado, paramedics, EMTs and other first responders, both paid and volunteer, serve the emergency and non-emergency needs of over one-half million residents and visitors annually. Vehicles, equipment, training, and ultimately the timeliness and quality of our service is inexorably linked to reimbursement.

The cost of each and every component of the EMS system has and will continue to increase steadily, but payments from commercial insurance, patients, Medicare and Medicaid are declining. Many EMS agencies, especially in rural areas, are struggling to survive. Some are reducing services—even closing.

Colorado's EMS agencies are experiencing dramatic increases in patients enrolled in Medicaid, now are the fastest growing medical payer type in Colorado. Given Medicaid pays roughly 9-11% of the current cost of an ambulance call, this expansion is severely straining many EMS agencies.

HB 15-1151 will almost double Medicaid payments paid to EMS agencies, and help reduce the effects of the increased Medicaid enrollment.
