A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING MODIFICATIONS REGARDING THE STATEWIDE INTERNET
102 PORTAL AUTHORITY.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <http://www.leg.state.co.us/bills/summaries>.)

The statewide internet portal authority (authority) was created by the general assembly to provide electronic government services for eligible governmental entities and residents.

The authority is governed by a board that includes the executive directors of 3 principal departments. Current law prohibits the executive directors from appointing a designee to sit on the board on behalf of the

executive director. The bill eliminates this provision and specifies that each executive director appointed to the board may appoint a designee to sit on the board.

The authority is currently required to submit 2 separate reports to different committees of the general assembly. The bill consolidates the 2 reports and requires the authority to submit one annual report to the members of the joint technology committee of the general assembly. In addition, the bill changes the reporting date from November 1 of each year to January 1 of each year.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-37.7-102, **amend**
3 (2) (a), (2) (b), (2) (c), and (2) (h) as follows:

4 **24-37.7-102. Statewide internet portal authority - creation -**
5 **board.** (2) The governing body of the authority shall be a board of
6 directors that shall consist of the following fifteen voting members:

18 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-37.7-106, **repeal**
19 (4) (b) as follows:

20 **24-37.7-106. Fees and charges - no modification - new services.**

13 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend**
14 24-37.7-113.5 as follows:

15 24-37.7-113.5. **Annual report.** (1) ~~On or before November 1,~~
16 ~~2013, and on November 1~~ JANUARY 1, 2016, AND ON OR BEFORE JANUARY
17 1 of each year thereafter, the authority shall submit a report TO THE
18 MEMBERS OF THE JOINT TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL
19 ASSEMBLY that ~~sets forth~~ INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING: <{*Check with SIPA*

22 (a) A complete and detailed operating and financial statement of
23 the authority during such THE PRECEDING fiscal year; ~~The report must also~~

25 ~~action that may be necessary to carry out the purposes of the authority.~~

26 (b) THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF CHARGES OR FEES IMPOSED BY EACH
27 STATE AGENCY FOR ACCESSING ELECTRONIC INFORMATION, PRODUCTS,

1 AND SERVICES THROUGH THE STATEWIDE INTERNET PORTAL MADE IN THE
2 PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-37.7-106; AND

3 (c) THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF RECEIPTS AND REVENUE DERIVED BY
4 THE AUTHORITY FROM THE TRANSACTIONS DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (b)
5 OF THIS SUBSECTION (1) FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR.

6 (2) THE REPORT REQUIRED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS
7 SECTION MUST ALSO INCLUDE ANY RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING
8 ADDITIONAL LEGISLATION OR OTHER ACTION THAT MAY BE NECESSARY TO
9 CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THE AUTHORITY.

10 (3) THIS SECTION IS EXEMPT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION
11 24-1-136 (11), AND THE ANNUAL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
12 SECTION ARE EFFECTIVE UNTIL CHANGED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
13 ACTING BY BILL.

14 **SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
15 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
16 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
17 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, if a
18 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
19 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
20 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
21 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
22 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
23 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor. <{Ask
