

#### Description:

The board consists of nine members, no more than five may be from the same political party. Seven of the members are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. The Commissioner of Education appoints two members. For appointments made after the effective date of Senate Bill 09-090, the Governor and the Commissioner must ensure that at least one member is a parent of a student who is, or had been, enrolled in an institute charter school. The board should reflect the geographic diversity of the state and members should have experience in one of the following areas:

- · charter school board member or founder;
- public school administrator with experience working with charter schools;
- financial management;
- · detailed knowledge of charter school law;
- other board or public service experience;
- public school teaching;
- on-line education and on-line curriculum development;
- school district special education; and
- · curriculum and assessment expertise.

Members serve three-year terms. No member may serve more than six consecutive years.

During his or her term in office, a member of the board may not be a member of the General Assembly; an officer, employee, or board member of a school district or charter school in the state; or an employee of the Institute Board or Dept. of Education.
