We write in support of HB 15-1157. The Colorado Office of Economic Development and International Trade (OEDIT) has worked tirelessly, with the support of this and previous legislatures, business and other stakeholders across our state, to develop and execute initiatives and programming to ensure that Colorado attracts businesses and fosters growth and retention.

As we have come out of the Great Recession, we have witnessed a disparity in the growth across regions in our state. We believe that HB 15-1157 would assist OEDIT as we explore new and innovative ideas to address the anemic economic growth in distressed areas of the state.
